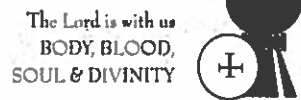

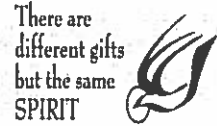

Dear Friends,  
Since today is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, last Sunday must have been the first. We didn't realize it because it was also the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Through baptism, we each became members of the Body of Christ, the Church. It may seem quite "ordinary," but it certainly is not, as our baptism was the occasion of our rebirth in the Spirit. As we celebrate Ordinary Time today, may we realize the extraordinariness of God's grace.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** Today's readings narrate a number of awesome events. Ancient Jerusalem has been restored to prominence, early Christians are healing others and speaking in tongues, Jesus changes water into wine. All of these things are attributable to God: God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Let us not forget that we too have the Spirit within us and have the power to awe others by what we do.

**STEWARDSHIP:** St. Paul reminds us that Stewardship is a dynamic reality that changes according to giftedness and circumstances. To be good Stewards of the gifts God has given us, we must first examine the areas in which we spend our time, use our talents, and give of our treasure. It is interesting to see a pattern of our daily lives through our calendars and our checkbooks. Just as there are many different types of people in a parish, there are also many different types of service activities within the parish community. Pray together as a family and ask God to help you recognize the gifts He has bestowed on you. Then, in gratitude, ask how you can best share those gifts in His service and the service of your brothers and sisters in need.

**A REMINDER:** Tuesday, January 22 is the 46th Remembrance of the Supreme Court's decision to legalize abortion. Please pray for an end to abortion and keep those who will be witnessing in Washington DC at the March for Life in your prayers.

**A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:** How am I challenged to live my life differently? Can I recognize the Spirit when I am challenged to change?

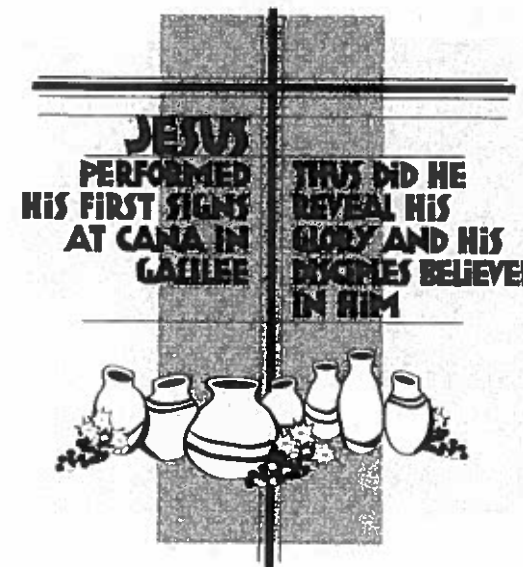

Baptism: Celebrated after the weekend Liturgies by appointment. Baptismal preparation class required. Contact the parish office to register.

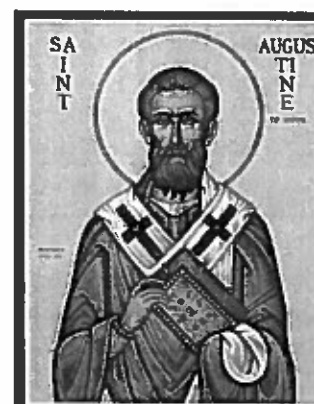
Reconciliation: Seasonal penance services offered throughout the year, on Saturday at 3:30 pm at St. Augustine Church or by appointment at any time.

We invite everyone 18 or older to register at the office as adults.

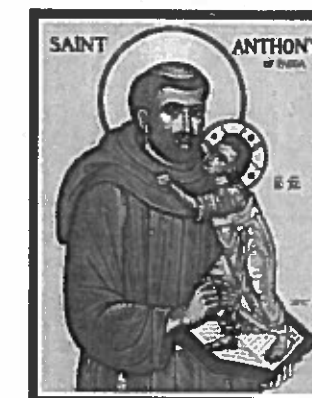
