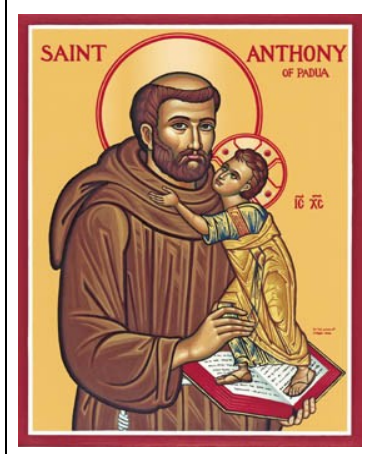
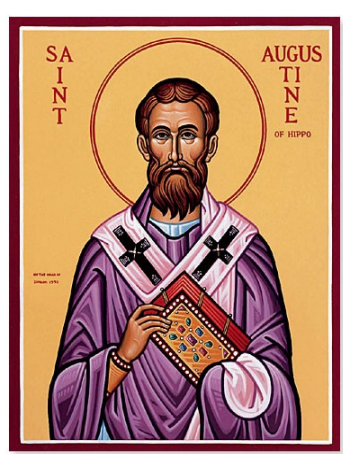

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, the risen Lord appears to the disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He had already appeared to them in the upper room in Jerusalem-twice-but they still didn't recognize him until he led them to catch a miraculous number of fish. We too may not recognize the risen Lord in our lives, yet we know he is present-as we gather together, in the Eucharist itself, in those whom we love, in the stranger in need. Let us pray for God's grace in recognizing the risen Lord in our midst.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Continuing our Easter celebration, we hear accounts of the period following the Resurrection. The Sanhedrin forbade the apostles to preach in the Lord's name, but they took the reprimand as a badge of honor. The visionary John saw angels and elders praising and worshiping the Lamb. Before ascending to the Father, Jesus appeared again to his disciples and called upon Peter to care for his flock. Let us hear the wonder and joy in the words of those who had seen the risen Lord.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus personally calls Simon Peter to "feed my lambs." We also are called to be disciples of Jesus. Each of us must discern, accept, and live out joyfully and generously the commitments, responsibilities and roles to which God calls us individually. Christian Stewards respond in a particular way to the call to be Jesus' disciples. The Steward is grateful for the gifts he or she has received and is eager to use them to show love for God and for one another.
