



Dear Friends.

Every Sunday Jesus draws us here, as a shepherd draws his flock. "My sheep hear my voice," he says in today's Gospel, "and they follow me." Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He feeds his flock, with his own Body and Blood. He loves his flock, suffering and dying for us. He provides for his flock by sending us the Holy Spirit. At home in the comforting embrace of our Good Shepherd, we join together today in thanks and praise.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: When Paul and Barnabas returned to the synagogue in Antioch, "almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord." Our turnout today may not rival theirs, but we hear the same comforting message that Jesus came to bring salvation to all. In Revelation, John describes his vision in which the Lamb shepherds people of every background to a place of life and joy. In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that he-the Good Shepherd-gives his flock eternal life. With the eagerness of the people of Antioch, let us listen to the word of the Lord.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus calls us, as his disciples, to a new way of life: the Christian way of life--of which stewardship is part. He does not call us as nameless people in a faceless crowd. He calls us individually, by name. Each one of us -- clergy, religious, lay person; married, single; adult, child has a personal vocation. God intends each one of us to play a unique role in carrying out the divine plan. The challenge, then, is to understand our role--our vocation and to respond generously to this call from God. Christian vocation entails the practice of stewardship. In addition, Christ calls each of us to be stewards of our personal vocations, which we receive from God.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> We extend to all the Mothers of the two parishes our gratitude on this Mother's Day weekend. We also extend out "thanks" to all who worked and supported the Holy Name Breakfast. The image of the Good Shepherd bringing the lost sheep back to the fold is a touching reminder to us all that no one is to be lost and all are to be sought.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How can I be the kind of person to shepherd someone else?
