

Dear Friends,

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Three persons in one God. Easy to say, but difficult to understand, for it is a mystery beyond our comprehension. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples that everything the Father has is his and that the Holy Spirit will take from all that they have. Their relationship to each other is complete and entire. The Father sent the Son to be united with humanity, to suffer with us, and to redeem us. The Father and Son sent the Holy Spirit to be with us always, guiding and sanctifying us. We come together today to praise God, who through the Trinity has given us more than we could ever expect.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Before the Trinity was revealed, the author of Proverbs personified God's wisdom as an entity distinct from God and deigning to stay on the earth God created. Saint Paul teaches the Romans that through the Son and Holy Spirit, we share in God's grace and God's love. In the Gospel Jesus promises his disciples the Holy Spirit, who guides us to all truth. With all that we have received from our generous God, we can truly sing, "0 Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!"

STEWARDSHIP: Today's responsorial psalm is a steward's response to God's love for humankind that begins with God at work as Creator, Maker of all that is. The steward has a profound reverence for the great gift of life, along with readiness to serve all that preserves and enhances life. Let our love and respect for life reflect God's creative love.

<u>A REMINDER</u>:__Every time we make the Sign of the Cross we invoke the three-fold Name of God as Father – Creator, Son – Redeemer and Holy Spirit – Sanctifier.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK</u>: Am I conscious of God's love being poured into my heart? How can I pour it out this week to those I meet?
