



Dear Friends.

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few," Jesus laments in today's Gospel. Indeed, the kingdom of God is full of plenty, but always there are opportunities to build it up in the way we bring God's love to others. Nourished in the Word and the Eucharist, we go forth to labor for the kingdom. This weekend, we also celebrate the anniversary of our country's founding, appreciative of what we have while we labor to build a more perfect union. May our labors on behalf of God and country be blessed and fruitful.

<u>THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:</u> Today we hear Jesus send his disciples out two by two into the surrounding region to witness to the coming of the kingdom of God. They are not the only ones preaching good news today. Isaiah exults in the Chosen People's return to Jerusalem. In the psalm we cry out to God with joy. Paul boasts in the cross of Jesus, for it has led to a new creation. May the examples of the prophets and apostles inspire us in our discipleship, so that we too may spread the Good News and return rejoicing.

STEWARDSHIP: The life of a Christian steward, lived in imitation of the life of Christ, is challenging, even difficult in many ways; but both here and hereafter it is charged with intense joy. Like Paul, the good steward is led to share in the work of proclaiming the Good News in everyday life, and is able to boast of identification with Jesus.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Looking forward to the 246th Anniversary of the Founding of our Country, let us celebrate not only with fireworks but mostly with hearts set a fire with gratitude and thankfulness for the freedoms, rights, and liberties we hold so dear.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> Where do I need to sow peace this week? What will I do in order to labor for the harvest? God bless.
