

Dear Friends,

We like to think of Jesus bringing peace and joy, healing and inspiration as he traveled from village to village with his disciples. But at this point in Luke's Gospel he is making his way to Jerusalem, where he knows what he will face, and his message has become sobering. The road to redemption is difficult. Jesus knew that sin and evil must be confronted. Our own encounters with sin and evil can be divisive, as Jesus warned his disciples. Let us pray for the will and the courage to stand up for what is right and good and holy, no matter the consequences.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: We hear Jesus tell his disciples that he has come to set the earth on fire. Centuries before, Jeremiah set the earth on fire with his fiery preaching against injustice. Both find themselves persecuted by authorities. But divisive as their words are, God watches over them. Jeremiah is rescued. Jesus is raised from the dead. May their example help us to avoid growing weary and losing heart when we struggle to carry out our mission.

STEWARDSHIP: Today, the encumbrance of sin includes not just the quest for pleasure but avarice, a craving for the illusion of absolute dominion and control, valuing creatures without reference to their Creator, excessive individualism, and ultimately the fear of death unrelieved by hope for eternal life. But if we accept God's grace and, repenting, struggle to change, the Spirit of wisdom and courage will help us seek pardon and be mindful that the most important work of our lives is to be Jesus' disciples. **A REMINDER:** Monday is a Holy Day of the Assumption (but because it falls on Monday this year – is not a holyday of obligation). However there will be a morning Mass at St. Augustine at 8am and a joint outside Partnership Mass at St. Dominic at 7pm (bring a lawn chair, weather permitting; otherwise will be held in their Church).

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: Can I feel the fire within that leads me to speak out and speak up despite the consequences?
