



Dear Friends,

Be prepared always, Jesus tells his disciples in today's Gospel, for the Son of Man will come like a thief in the night. This is our challenge now. Are we truly prepared for the day when our time here on earth comes to end? Will we be prepared if it comes this year, this week, or even this day? Today, let us pray that with God's grace we may always be ready for that day when we see the Lord face to face. May the Eucharist nourish and strengthen us as we grow as disciples.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: The readings from Wisdom and Hebrews look back in time to pivotal events when believers had to put great faith in God. In captivity in Egypt, the Chosen People trusted that the Lord would pass over their homes on the night that the firstborn were slain. Generations before that, Abraham and Sarah left everyone they knew to follow God to the promised land. It is that kind of faith that Jesus tries to instill in his disciples so that they will be ready when he comes again in glory. Let us pray that our own faith may be strengthened as we listen to God's word.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus sometimes describes a disciple's life in terms of stewardship, because this role sheds a certain light on discipleship. A steward is one to whom the owner of a household turns over responsibility for caring for the property, managing affairs, making resources yield as much as possible, and sharing the resources with others. The position involves trust and accountability. One day God will require an accounting of the use each person has made of the particular portion of what God has entrusted to him or her.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: Our schools are preparing for another year of learning and faith growth. Our teachers this week are preparing their classrooms and lesson plans and holding their annual pre-school institutes. Let us pray for our teachers and staff members that the 2022-2023 school year may be a time of blessing for them.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How can I be a faithful servant to the Lord as I wait patiently upon him?
