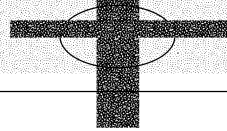

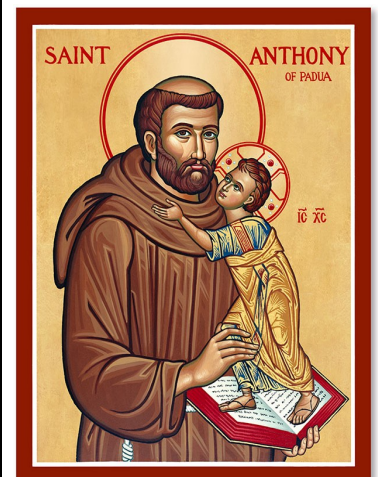

Dear Friends,

Too late! While he was alive, the rich man in today's Gospel ignored the beggar Lazarus at his gate. Now he suffers in torment. In death a great chasm separates him from paradise, an expanse he can never cross. It is too late for this man who spent his life taking care of himself and ignoring those in need. But it is not too late for us. No matter our age, we can change our attitudes and behavior. As the seasons change around us, let us consider the possibility of change within us.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Amos condemns the people of Zion in today's first reading, for they relax in complacency and self-absorption while their country is collapsing. In the Gospel, Jesus condemns the rich man to an eternity in torment after he spent his life in luxury while ignoring the beggar at his gate. Whom do we ignore while enjoying the comfort of our own lives? As we listen to God's word, let us look at our own life from the point of view of someone like Lazarus. How would someone like him see us?

STEWARDSHIP: All the rich materials and productions of this world, being God's property, are intended for God's service; and sin only, nothing but sin, turns them to a different purpose. The Christian steward has some natural responsibility for a portion of the world and an obligation in caring for it to acknowledge God's dominion.

A REMINDER: Attitudes can be shaped early in a child's development and can last a lifetime. Our attitudes toward the poor, the homeless, the recluse will be seen in our behavior. Why do we think the way we do about them and how do we pass on our attitude to our children?

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: Who is the "Lazarus" at my gate? What can I do for them this week?

In solidarity, Clinton County Life Chain will be observed at all exits along the New Rt. 50 on Sunday, October 2nd, 2-3pm.

LIFE CHAIN is a time for prayerful self-analysis, repentance, and serious commitment to helping end abortion in our nation. Accordingly, LIFE CHAIN is not chiefly a demonstration, and its witness is not intended for the viewing public only. Instead, its first goal is to minister to its own participants – to those who call Christ their Lord and hold pro-life messages that declare abortion a grave evil that defames the name and holiness of God (Leviticus 18:21).

Water will be provided, and lawn chairs and umbrellas are suggested for some. Posters and prayer cards are available at site. Life Chain welcomes all defenders of nascent human life and we especially invite pastors and their congregations, youth groups, families and friends to join us as your prayer, support and presence are welcomed and needed. I was in my Mother's womb and you . . . prayed for me, supported me, and rescued me. Thank you.
