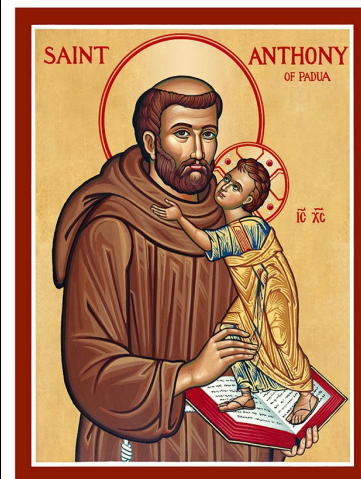
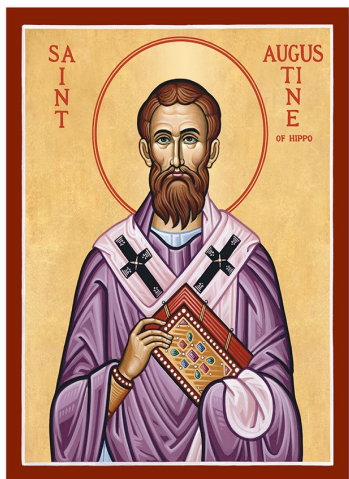

Dear Friends,

Often we feel that our faith is weak, unable to overcome all our doubts or give us the confidence to face our trials. Jesus' closest friends, his apostles, may have felt the same way, as today we hear them ask him to increase their faith. Jesus responds by issuing them a challenge, telling them that even a small amount of faith has the power to do great things. Let us accept that challenge today, recognizing that our faith, however uncertain, has brought us here in the first place to worship the Lord and celebrate the Eucharist.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** Habakkuk, living in a time of strife and violence in his nation, cries out to God, "I cry for help but you do not listen!" How many of us have felt the same way? God appeals to Habakkuk to have faith, assuring him that faith gives hope and life to the just one. Paul tells Timothy that faith and love can be found in Christ Jesus. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples how even a little faith can enable them to work wonders. May God's word strengthen our faith and give us the courage to trust in the Lord.

**STEWARDSHIP:** Although religious faith is a strong force in the lives of many Americans, our country's dominant secular culture often contradicts the values of the Judeo-Christian tradition. There is a strong tendency to privatize faith, to push it to the margins of society, confining it to people's hearts or, at best, their homes, while excluding it from the marketplace of ideas where social policy is formed and men and women acquire their view of life and its meaning. Vatican II calls this split between faith and life one of the more serious errors of our age.

**A REMINDER:** Please welcome Fr. Pat to the St. Augustine 4pm Mass and Fr. George to the St. Anthony 5:30pm Mass, as I have a Diocesan Knights of Columbus commitment. This week the priests of the Belleville diocese will meet in their Annual Convocation with Bishop McGovern and on Friday is the Diocesan Teachers Convention. Please keep these gatherings in your prayers this week. There will be no weekday Masses at either parish during this week.

**A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:** What injustice, conflict, or problem does faith give me the power to address? How can I put my faith into action?
