



We must ask ourselves: Do we also wish to be disciples of Jesus Christ and Christian stewards of our world and our Church?

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Each new year brings with it uncertainty but also hope and promise. May 2023 be a year of grace and favor for you and a time of many blessings.

Is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, a holy day of obligation?

Yes, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, is a holy day of obligation. The Church encourages all Catholics, who are able, to attend Mass on the Solemnity. The USCCB allows two exceptions, however: when the Solemnity falls on a Saturday or Monday, "the precept to attend Mass is abrogated." Most likely, in years when the Solemnity falls on one of these days, your parish will celebrate the Solemnity the Sunday before.

"My serious discernment of the priesthood began with my discovery of St. John Bosco when I was 16. I received a letter about his life from a vocation director for the Salesians – the religious order he founded – and the more I learned, the more I wanted to become a priest. I was inspired by the way St. John Bosco allowed God to work in his life and his work to help those most in need. After my sophomore year at Louisiana Tech University, I again felt God calling, however, this time I realized that God was calling me to the diocesan priesthood. Once I graduated, I entered seminary. To anyone else discerning the priesthood, I offer the same advice I received from the vocation director for the Salesians: Stay close to Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and to the Blessed Mother.
