



Dear Friends.

We call this period of the liturgical year "Ordinary Time," but this time after Christmas is not ordinary at all, for it is now that we learn about the first days of Jesus' public life. In today's Gospel, John testifies that the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus when John baptized him, meaning that the Holy Spirit joined in Christ's entire mission. The Holy Spirit descended upon us in our own baptism as well. May we be conscious of that divine presence as we join in Christ's mission during our own ordinary time.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Before we receive the Lord in the Eucharist, we hear the words, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." We will hear these words in today's Gospel, for they were first proclaimed by John the Baptist. John, Isaiah, and Paul all testify to how the Lord has called them and changed their lives. May we be inspired by them and take to heart what we sing in the responsorial psalm: "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

STEWARDSHIP: From conception, Gods calls us to follow Jesus and to make stewardship a way of life. God invites us to accept and to live out joyfully and generously the commitments, responsibilities, and roles to which He calls us. Following Jesus is the work of a lifetime. At every step forward, we are challenged to go further in accepting and loving God's will. Being a disciple is a total way of life and requires constant conversion.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Let us consider that no time we spend in the Lord's presence is "ordinary" but rather that it is "Extraordinary." <u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> How can I be a better witness to the truth, to what I see with eyes of faith?
