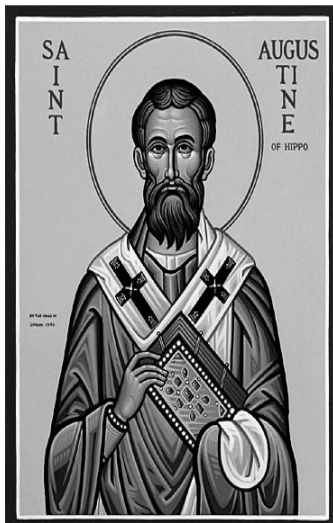

Dear Friends,

“Do not be afraid,” Jesus says in today’s Gospel to Jairus, whose daughter is dying, “just have faith.” Difficult as it was for Jairus, it may seem to be even harder for us now. When we are in mourning for a loved one we’ve lost, or anxious about our health or that of someone close to us, or worried about the state of the world or our country, can we find faith strong enough to calm our fears? Gathered here today to give thanks and praise to God, may the words from Wisdom encourage us. God is good and imperishable and made us to be the same. Let us place our trust in God.

THIS WEEK’S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Wisdom reminds us that we are created in God’s image to share in God’s nature. However, because of sin, we have become mortal beings. But the Lord has rescued us, for Jesus has restored life and defeated death. His healings of Jairus’s daughter and the woman with hemorrhages show his power to do so. To paraphrase what Paul wrote to the Corinthians, by giving of himself, Jesus has graciously enriched us.

STEWARDSHIP: God is infinite in gifts, so there is no need to hoard those entrusted to us. The role of the disciple is to witness the richness of God in concern for those less fortunate.

A REMINDER: On Thursday of this week, we celebrate the 248th Anniversary of the Founding of our Nation. May we always be grateful to God for the liberties, freedoms, and rights we hold so dear and remember at what price was paid and continues to be paid, by those who honorably serve, to guarantee, protect, and defend what we cherish.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How does my faith affect the way I anticipate death? How can it increase my courage? How can I encourage others to keep the faith?

Pro-Life Corner: -The Clinton County Citizens for Life, in coordination with churches throughout the county, will host a one hour **Pro-Life Prayer Service** the second Thursday of each month in 2024. Please join us on **Thursday, July 11th at St. George Catholic Church in New Baden from 7-8pm;** praying our state and nation will get back on a moral and virtuous path and our culture will change to more fully appreciate and cherish our Lord's precious gift of life.

-Dangers of the Abortion PillChemical abortion is dangerous for women. From September 2000 through December 2022, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recorded 4,218 “adverse events” caused by the process— including the deaths of 32 women. Although the FDA stopped requiring reports of non-fatal adverse events in 2016, a combination of pre-2016 required reporting and post-2016 voluntary reporting also indicates serious non-fatal consequences. These include 1,049 non-fatal hospitalizations, 604 cases of blood loss requiring transfusions, 97 ectopic pregnancies, and 418 infections of which 75 were “severe.” These numbers are likely underestimates, because many adverse events are experienced at home and treated in emergency rooms, where they are often reported as related to miscarriages rather than to abortion pills. https://www.usccb.org/sites/default/files/2024-03/abortionpills_basics_3.2024.pdf
