



Dear Friends,

Each week we gather here as a family of faith, expressing our faith and deepening our faith as we celebrate the Eucharist together. Yet, we may still feel that our faith is weak, especially if we compare ourselves to others we know. But do you know what? So did the twelve apostles. Today we hear them ask the Lord to increase their faith. May his response hearten us, his present-day disciples, as we struggle with our own faith.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: The prophet Habakkuk cries out to God in frustration, upset that nothing is being done about the discord and violence in Judah. "Patience," God answers. The apostles cry out to Jesus, complaining their faith isn't strong enough. "You have plenty," Jesus assures them. May we not be too timid to cry out to God in our need, may we listen for God's reassuring voice, and, as we sing in the psalm, may we harden not our hearts.

STEWARDSHIP: Although religious faith is a strong force in the lives of many Americans, our country's dominant secular culture often contradicts the values of the Judaeo-Christian tradition. There is a strong tendency to privatize faith, to push it to the margins of society, confining it to people's hearts or, at best, their homes, while excluding it from the marketplace of ideas where social policy is formed and men and women acquire their view of life and its meaning. Vatican II calls this split between faith and life one of the more serious errors of our age.

A REMINDER: As we commemorate Pro-Life Sunday, let us remember the sanctity of human life and our need as a society and culture to adapt a 'Culture of Life" and work toward respect for all humans, as well as for our environment. Fr. Carl Scherrer will be presiding at the 4pm Saturday Mass at St. Augustine next weekend.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What can I do this week to be an "unprofitable servant" in God's eyes?
