Dear Friends,

Today's readings warn us that the day is coming when we will be tested severely. How do we prepare for the ultimate test? We trust that the Holy Spirit will guide us. The Holy Spirit draws us to this place each week where we are nourished and strengthened in the Eucharist. The Holy Spirit nudges us to obey our conscience. The Holy Spirit fills us with the virtues we need to do God's will. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit will watch over us and guide us through all our trials and tribulations.

<u>THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON</u>: Malachi sets the mood for today's readings in a matter of seconds, warning that the day of judgment is coming, when the world will be reduced to rubble and God will show no mercy to the wicked. Paul reproves those in the Christian community in Thessalonica who have given up and grown lazy and disorderly. Jesus warns the people gathered in the temple that the day will come when all they see around them will be destroyed, but that God will protect those who persevere in the faith. Let us pray that we can truly welcome that day when God comes to rule the earth with justice.

<u>STEWARDSHIP:</u> Paul set an example of ministry for the Thessalonians; Mary most perfectly teaches the meaning of discipleship and stewardship. All of their essential elements are found in her life: she was called and gifted by God; she responded generously, creatively, and prudently; she understood her divinely assigned role as "handmaid" in terms of service and fidelity. Now is the time to examine what example of stewardship we set.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> As we celebrated the Major Basilica of St. John Lateran last Sunday, on Tuesday of this week on the 18th, we celebrate two more of the four Major Basilicas of Rome: St. Peters and St. Paul Outside the Wall. Together with St. Mary Major (which is celebrated on August 5) these four Basilicas have the special 'Holy Doors" that Pope Francis opened for the Holy Year on December 24, 2024. The Holy Doors are sacred portals found within the four major Papal basilicas in Rome. These doors are ceremonially opened only during Jubilee Years, symbolizing the spiritual journey from sin to grace. For pilgrims, crossing these doors is a profound act of faith, offering an opportunity for renewal, forgiveness, and a deeper connection with the divine. The tradition of the Holy Doors dates back to 1423 when Pope Martin V first opened the door at St. John Lateran. Since then, the custom has expanded to include Rome's four major basilicas. Each basilica's Holy Door is sealed from the inside and only opened during Jubilee years by the Pope, marking the start of a Holy Year.

<u>Diocesan:</u> Please contact Governor Pritzker to VETO SB 1950 - Legalizing Assisted Suicide

At 2:54 AM on Oct. 31, the Illinois State Senate narrowly passed SB 1950. The State House narrowly passed the bill in the spring. The bill is now on the Governor's desk. This is the last chance to stop assisted suicide from becoming law in Illinois. Please call Gov. Pritzker and inform him: people with disabilities, the poor, and marginalized fear coercion and abuse under assisted suicide laws, suicide rates increase in states where assisted suicide is legal, and there are possible cost savings to insurance companies if assisted suicide is legal, as they can provide cheaper lethal drugs instead of lifesaving treatment.
