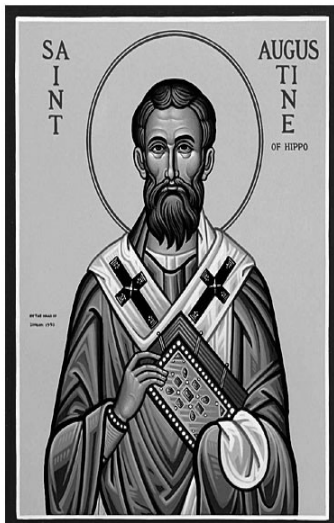

Dear Friends,

It's one of the deepest mysteries of our faith: how three persons can be united in one divine being. On the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, we praise God the Father for sending the Son to save us from our sins and the Holy Spirit to remain with us always. The Holy Spirit draws us together as the body of Christ to receive the Son in the Eucharist and give glory to God the Father, in whose image we have been created. Let us praise and give thanks to Father, Son, and Holy Spirit for the infinite love and mercy we have received.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: God's love for us comes across vividly in today's readings. God promises Moses to be merciful, gracious, and rich in kindness. Paul tells the Corinthians that the God of love and peace will be with them as they treat each other with love and live in peace. John points out that Christ's sacrifice on the cross is a vivid sign of God's great love for us. Let us listen to God's word with grateful hearts.

STEWARDSHIP: The Trinity is a sign of the love that stewards must have for one another. St. Paul exhorts us to encourage one another: we do this by giving thanks to God for gifts received and striving to share them with others. We are called to mirror, however poorly, God's love.

A REMINDER: Every time we make the Sign of the Cross we not only invoke the fullness of the Oneness of God, but we also sign ourselves with the symbol of our salvation – the Cross. May we not make the sign in haste or in a lazy halfhearted attempt – but rather with a conviction and reverence deserving of the relevance of what we are doing.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What will I do this week to reflect the qualities of the divine essence?
