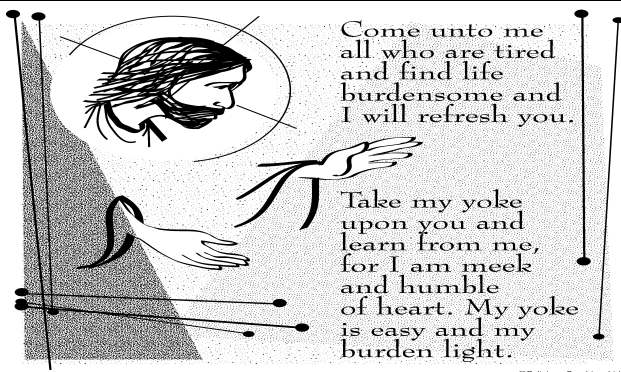

We encourage everyone 18 or older to register at the office as an adult parishioner.

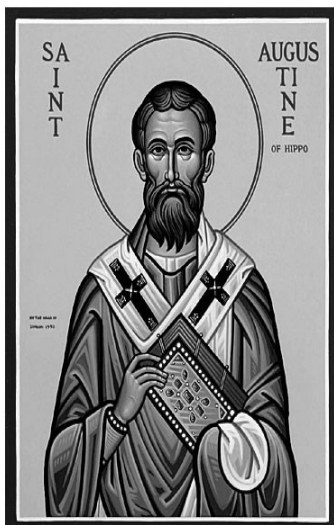

Dear Friends,

Jesus knows that our lives are difficult. The mission he left for us is challenging. Additionally, we have dozens of day-to-day responsibilities and concerns. He's just told his disciples that they must carry their crosses. But he also promises that he will be with us to carry our crosses when we are overwhelmed. Therefore, he is able to assure everyone who labors and is burdened that he will give them rest. His yoke is easy, and his burden light. Gathered here today, let us put our concerns and anxieties in the Lord's hands and allow him to lift our burdens from our shoulders.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: The king shall come, Zechariah prophesied, not in a chariot with weapons drawn, but on a lowly ass, proclaiming peace. He anticipates Jesus telling his disciples that he is meek and humble of heart, as we hear today. Christ is the king the Father sent: gracious and merciful—as we sing in the psalm—slow to anger, greatly kind, and compassionate toward us all. Let us give thanks and praise to the Lord, in whom we can always find rest.

STEWARDSHIP: We pray that we will be open to the grace to respond to the challenge of stewardship, and that the Holy Spirit, Whose gracious action conforms us to Jesus Christ and to the Church, will enlighten us and help us to renew our commitment as the Lord's disciples and as stewards of his bountiful gifts.

A REMINDER: We celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the Founding of our Nation this weekend. May our festivities also include a gratitude to God for the blessings bestowed upon the United States in all those years and for the liberty, freedom, and rights we cherish and which are protected on a daily basis by those who serve so nobly in the Armed Forces.
