



Dear Friends,

"Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world," proclaims John the Baptist in today's Gospel as Jesus comes to him to be baptized. We hear these words proclaimed again each Sunday when we are invited to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. Jesus, before he was led like a lamb to slaughter, shared his Body and Blood with his closest friends and asked that they continue to do this in his memory. We are indeed blessed to be called to this Eucharistic meal.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Isaiah, Paul, and John the Baptist were each called by God for a special purpose. Isaiah tells us of being called to reach out first to the exiled people of Israel and then to all nations. Paul tells the Corinthians that he was called to be an apostle. John was called to make Jesus known by baptizing with water. Now it is our turn to listen for God's call. Then we can respond, as we do in today's psalm, "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

STEWARDSHIP: From conception, God calls us to follow Jesus and to make stewardship a way of life. God invites us to accept and to live out joyfully and generously the commitments, responsibilities, and roles to which He calls us. Following Jesus is the work of a lifetime. At every step forward, we are challenged to go further in accepting and loving God's will. Being a disciple is a total way of life and requires constant conversion.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> The 2020 theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which begins on January 18, is: "They Showed Us Unusual Kindness" (cf. Acts 28:2). First observed in January, 1908, it has grown to become an energetic movement that gradually blossomed into a worldwide observance involving many nations and millions of people. This year our local Community Service will take place in St. Dominic Church on Thursday, January 23 at 7pm. All are welcome to attend with fellowship to follow in their Parish Center.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: Am I willing to serve those who are not of my own tribe, as did Isaiah, Paul, and John the Baptist?
