



Picture a lush meadow with a large flock of sheep enjoying the fresh air and sunshine. This first Sunday in May, situated right in the middle of spring, may lend itself to such daydreams, especially as we have been so isolated from each other within our own homes. But this is no daydream, for we indeed are part of a flock with a devoted shepherd, one who calls us each by name and invites us to have life and have it more abundantly. Let us join together today in joy and gratitude even as we continue to shelter in place and follow social distancing.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: The image of sheep dominates the readings today. The early church was just a fledgling flock when Peter's testimony inspired thousands to "repent and be baptized." Later, Peter commends the sheep for returning to the care of the shepherd after they had gone astray. In the Gospel, Jesus begins the story of the Good Shepherd. "The sheep hear his voice," he says, and follow him. Let us listen for his voice in today's readings.

STEWARDSHIP: The way of discipleship is privileged beyond any other. In today's gospel, we hear Jesus say: "I came that they might have life and have it to the full" (Jn 10. 10). But discipleship is not an easy way. The life of a Christian Steward models the life of Jesus. It is challenging and even difficult. In many respects, yet intense joy comes to those who take the risk to live as Christian Stewards.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Continue to follow the regulations regarding "shelter-in-place" and social distancing in order to keep the most vulnerable among us safe and to prevent the further spread of Covid-19. This is more then just a civil duty, it is a moral obligation.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> How is the Good Shepherd calling me? For what do I need to seek forgiveness so I can be reunited with the flock?
