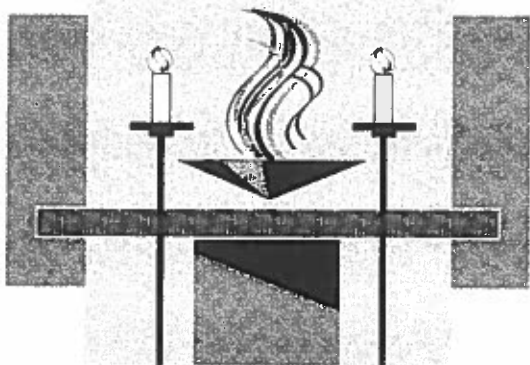

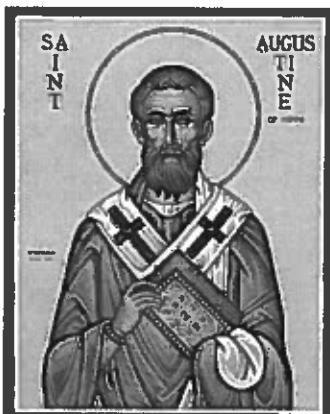
Reconciliation: Seasonal penance

at the office as adults.

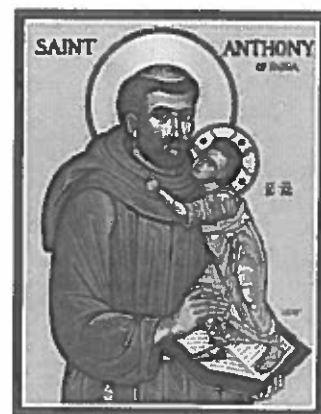

Dear Friends,

Today we honor our mothers, grandmothers, godmothers, and all who have been like mothers to us. Peter's words in today's second reading apply to many of them, for they have been cornerstones in our lives, chosen and precious. In the Gospel Jesus teaches his disciples that he shows the way to his Father. Many of us were shown the way to faith by our mothers. Let us pray for them today.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: "I am the way and the truth and the life," Jesus says to his disciples in the passage from John we hear today. He is the foundation on which we build our lives, the cornerstone of our spiritual home. As we continue to celebrate this Easter season, let us listen to God's word and discern the way, the truth, and the life that Jesus reveals to us.

STEWARDSHIP: In the Acts, Luke tells us that the Apostles took steps to build up the Church through personal participation in and support of the Church's mission of proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying. This participation takes different forms according to people's different gifts and offices, but there is a fundamental obligation arising from the sacrament of Baptism: that Jesus' disciples are "a royal priesthood" called to offer up the world and all that is in it - especially themselves - to the Lord of all. We exercise our stewardship, not merely by our own power but by the power of the Spirit of truth, whom Jesus promises to his followers.

A REMINDER: On this Mother's Day weekend, if social distancing and "shelter-in-place" restrictions keep us separated from our mothers, let us still turn to other means of communication such as telephone, email, texting, or video conferencing as ways to reach out and express our love, gratitude and concern for the individual who chose life for us.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How can I serve the Church more fully? What can I do to contribute to Jesus' mission?

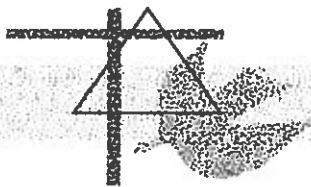
