



Dear Friends.

Today we honor the Holy Trinity-one God, yet three Persons. God is one, but God is not alone. God is love and in the Trinity we have an ideal example of a relationship of pure and infinite love. Every time we make the sign of the cross may we be reminded of the love that bonds the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. May the love of the Holy Trinity be a model for us in our relationships with each other.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Don't let your mind wander during the readings today! Each of them is very short, so if you're not paying attention you might miss an entire one. You wouldn't want to do that, for in each case a lot is packed into just a few verses. God reveals the holy name in the first reading. Paul sums up his message to the Corinthians in the second. In the Gospel, John synthesizes Jesus' entire mission in three short verses. Let us listen as if each author is speaking directly to us.

<u>STEWARDSHIP</u>: The Trinity is a sign of the love that stewards must have for one another. St. Paul exhorts us to encourage one another: we do this by giving thanks to God for gifts received and striving to share them with others. We are called to mirror, however poorly, God's love.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> How do I respond to God's generosity? How can I share what I have been given in a way that imitates God's generosity?

The parishes of the Belleville Diocese received a communication the early evening of June 2 from the Bishop stating that "parishes may begin the regular celebration of the Eucharist this weekend, June 6-7." It also states "a maximum of 100 attendees." It goes on to further state "the 6-foot social distancing rule still applies as does frequent hand sanitization. Masks will be required before, during and after the celebration of the Eucharist."

In order to expedite all the requirements, restrictions, and guideline that we are being given the following procedures will be in place for both St. Anthony in Beckemeyer and St. Augustine in Breese:

- Our weekend and weekday Masses will take place in each of the two Parish Center Gyms. This will allow for proper spacing of the individuals and easier sanitization of the chairs following the Mass. (No Church bells will be rung 15 minutes prior nor at start of Mass, as we will not be in Church).
- 2) All individuals attending the Mass will be required to have their face mask with them and are to wear it at all times. Anyone not willing to wear a face mask will not be allowed to enter or remain. It is not a matter of Control—it is a matter of Charity— which is the care and concern for the well-being of another.
- 3) Upon entry the assigned greeter will check you in and direct you to sanitize your hands. You will be given a paper copy of the Mass parts—which will be yours to keep and bring back with you when you return again for Mass (or if you do not bring one you will be given another). Also the first time you will be attending—a trifold from the Diocese will be given you explaining the various procedures as well. We are not allowed to sing or personally recite out loud our responses. You will be asked to silently respond to the People's parts.
- 4) The ushers will lead you to your seat. At the conclusion of Mass you will be directed row by row out through the assigned doors. There will not be a procession by the Priest in nor out. You are asked not to congregate in the gym, the hallway or outside on Church property before or after the Mass. Only one person at a time is to use the appropriate restroom.
- 5) There will be no handshaking, holding of hands (no Sign of Peace), no holy water and no sharing of the Cup of the Precious Blood. We are to avoid any and all communal forms and displays which could jeopardize the health of another.
- 6) Communion will only be given with the host in the hand—and never on the tongue. The Priest only will be distributing Communion and will come to each row– there will not be a line coming forward. You will be asked to stay at your place and to stand to receive Communion and remain seated if you are not going to receive Communion.
- 7) There will be no servers and no presentation of the gifts. The sacristan will have very limited access to the sacred vessels before Mass.
- 8) All chairs are to remain at the spot on which they are pre-set. Chairs cannot be moved to be closer to someone else, even a family member. If you have a child (10 and under) they should remain with one of the parents at their chair. Children are not allowed to roam and are to remain under the supervision of one or the other parent at all times.
- 9) If you are ill, showing any signs of sickness, have a fever or don't feel good: you are to remain at home. A video of the weekend Mass will still be available on each of the two parish webpages. During this pandemic a special dispensation has also been granted that an individual may attend a Mass during the weekdays to fulfill their Sunday obligation. The obligation to attend is not binding on those who are elderly (considered 65+), have preexisting health conditions that could impede their immune system or in conscience have a fear of being vulnerable to a possible virus exposure.

As the risk level changes, our response will change appropriately according to Diocesan and Health Department guidelines. Your cooperation and understanding will go a long way in making this challenging and difficult time less stressful, so as to be dealt with in Christian Charity, Hope and Faith.


