



Dear Friends,

Do we have the courage to place our trust in the Lord? Peter thought he had enough courage when he stepped out of the boat as it was tossed on the waves during a violent storm. But he became frightened and started to sink. Though he began to doubt, he cried out to Jesus and the Lord saved him. When we doubt, may we look to our Savior for strength.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Elijah and Peter each encounter the Lord in an unusual way in today's readings. Elijah expected the Lord to come in the wind, in an earthquake, or with fire, but instead it was in a tiny whispering sound. The Lord appeared like a ghost to the disciples during a storm and Peter dared to walk across the raging sea. How do we encounter the Lord? Here in this space we encounter the Lord in his Church, gathered together in his name, and in the Eucharist.

<u>STEWARDSHIP</u>: Being a steward means having a profound trust in God - living with trust in God's generosity and a responsible tending of that which God has entrusted to us. If we have such trust God will calm the storms that surround our lives.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Beginning next week we will be returning to morning Masses on Tuesdays at 7:30am in Beckemeyer and Wednesdays at 8am in Breese (still remaining in the Parish Centers' Gyms for the present moment). Guidance for Non-liturgical Meetings

Non-liturgical gatherings of up to 50 people are allowed as long as social distancing and cleaning/disinfecting guidelines are adhered to and masks are worn. Please note the following:

- Meetings such as parish committees, Knights of Columbus, bingo, blood drives, book clubs, just to name a few, are permitted on parish campuses. You must communicate the COVID-19 safety protocols and guidelines to these groups, but recognize that the responsibility to ensure compliance resides with the parish staff.
- A pre-registration and/or attendance record-keeping process must be in place to support contact tracing efforts, which are vital to reducing the spread of COVID-19.
- To the extent possible, consideration should be given to holding meetings outdoors with proper social distancing measures in place.
- Hand sanitizer should be readily available for meetings.
- Regarding food and beverages at meetings, all food and beverages must be in single-serve containers. Individual boxed lunches are permitted. Open buffets, potlucks and/or boxes of bagels, cookies or donuts are not permitted. Single, unopened bottles of water are permitted, but a pitcher of water is not. All utensils and plates must be disposable and intended for one-time use.
