





We gather each weekend with family, friends, and neighbors to worship God, a God of mercy, a God of healing, a God always willing to forgive. We are called to do the same. We are called to reconcile with our family member, our friend, our neighbor, just as God reconciles with us when we turn away. May the nourishment we receive at the Lord's table strengthen us as we face the challenge of forgiving each other.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: "How often must I forgive?" Peter asks Jesus," As many as seven times?" Jesus shocks Peter with this but explains it by telling him a parable that dramatically illustrates the importance of forgiveness. Sirach too teaches us a lesson contrasting vengeance and forgiveness. "We are the Lord's," Paul reminds us, so as we listen to today's readings let us hear what the Lord is calling us to do.

<u>STEWARDSHIP</u>: Stewardship is a uniquely solemn trust. If we understand it and strive to live it to the full, we grasp the fact that we are no less than God's co-workers, with our own particular share in God's creative, redemptive, and sanctifying work. In this light, as stewards, we are fully conscious of our accountability. We neither live nor die as our own masters; rather, we are the Lord's.

A REMINDER: On this Grandparent's Day weekend, may we turn to the words of Sirach: "Now will I praise those godly men and women, our ancestors, each in their own time: these were godly individuals whose virtues have not been forgotten; their wealth remains in their families, their heritage with their descendants; through God's covenant with them their family endures, their posterity, for their sake. And for all time their progeny will endure, their glory will never be blotted out; their bodies are peacefully laid away, but their name lives on and on. At gatherings their wisdom is retold, and the assembly proclaims their praise".

<u>A OUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> How can I keep a consistent forgiving attitude that assuages my anger? What leads me to forgive one who hurt me?
