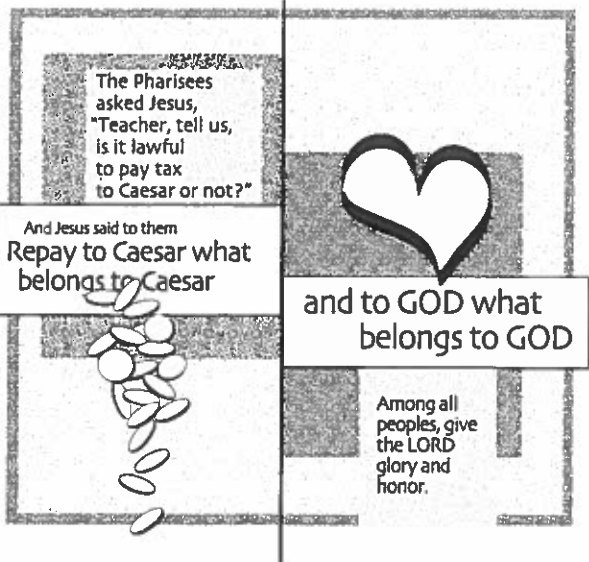

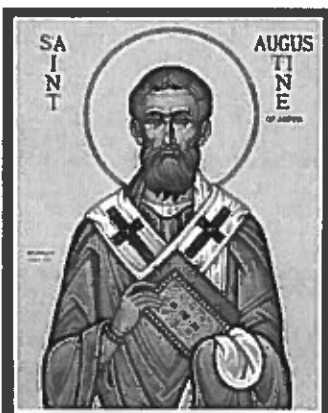
Reconciliation: Seasonal penance services offered throughout the year, on Saturday at 3:30 pm at St. Augustine Church or by appointment at any time.

We invite everyone 18 or older to register at the office as adults.

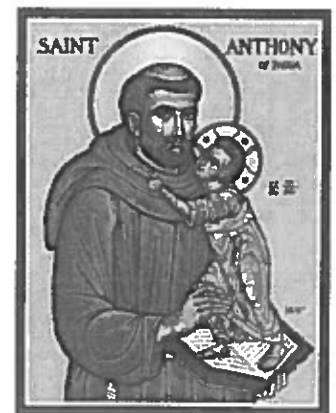

Dear Friends,

Undoubtedly we have spent much of the past week doing things others have asked us to do: work for our bosses, errands for our spouses, homework for our teachers, care for our children or parents. Hopefully we have spent part of the past week also doing the things God asks of us, though they may overlap quite a bit with the rest. Here and now, however, we dedicate this time to God. Let us reflect on all the gifts God has given us and lift our hearts and voices in thanksgiving and praise.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Two famous rulers dominate the readings today: Cyrus the Great and Tiberius Caesar. In the first reading we hear Isaiah extol Cyrus as God's anointed. Cyrus was not even Jewish, but he liberated the Jewish people when he conquered Babylon so Isaiah considered him sent by God. In the Gospel, Jesus distinguishes God's role from Caesar's when asked by the Pharisees about paying taxes. As we listen to the word of God, let us think of what belongs to God in our lives.

STEWARDSHIP: The steward accepts the Lord's call to live in faith, hope and love, to serve one another in His name. Christian discipleship begins with vocation, the call to follow Jesus and imitate His way of life. Jesus offers the grace and strength to live as His disciple and to practice stewardship.

A REMINDER: Please keep in your prayers our Eighth graders preparing to receive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Confirmation in the Spring at St. Anthony in Beckemeyer and who are being commissioned for their Faith Journey at our Masses this Sunday: seven from St. Anthony and three from St. Augustine.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: When I am reminded that everything is a gift from God, how do I respond? Do I fudge on what belongs to God as many fudge on what they owe to Caesar?
