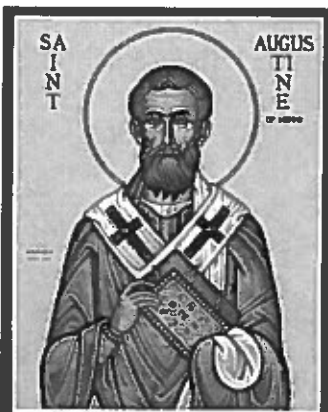
Reconciliation: Seasonal penance services offered throughout the year, on Saturday at 3:30 pm at St. Augustine Church or by appointment at any time.

We invite everyone 18 or older to register at the office as adults.

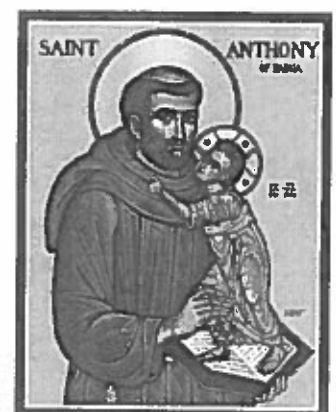

Dear Friends,

Today's readings speak of harvesting grapes in a vineyard. God calls us to work in the vineyard, each doing our part to ensure a good harvest. We gather together each week in the Lord's name and receive Christ in the word and the Eucharist. In today's Gospel, Jesus promises the kingdom of God to those who produce its fruit. We pray that we may be nourished in word and sacrament so that we may go forth to produce fruit for the kingdom.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: The selections from both Isaiah and Matthew feature vineyards in poor shape. In Isaiah's case, the vineyard is prepared diligently, but ends up being overrun by wild grapes. In Matthew, Jesus tells a parable whose vineyard is commandeered by greedy tenants who abuse and kill the landowner's representatives. Who then will produce good fruit for the kingdom? Paul encourages the Philippians to do so by continuing to do what they have learned from him. Let us learn from scripture how we can produce good fruit.

STEWARDSHIP: St. Paul reminds the Philippians that the life of a Christian steward, although challenging - even difficult - in many ways, is charged with intense joy. Those who seek to live as good stewards experience God's peace and mercy. They readily cry out from the heart: "Rejoice in the Lord always!"

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What one specific thing can I do with my time and talents to produce fruit in the vineyard I call home?
