



Once again we begin the season of Advent, this time of preparation for Christ's coming into the world on Christmas morning. But this is not the only arrival of Christ for which we can prepare. He comes into our hearts at any time in any way. He comes to us in the Eucharist. We hope to be welcomed into his arms when we leave this world. Finally, he will come again at the end of time. As we gather in his name today, let us contemplate how we can prepare to receive Christ even when we least expect him.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Today's readings remind us that waiting for the Lord is not a passive exercise. Isaiah prays that God "might meet us doing right," rejecting our sinful ways. Jesus warns his disciples that they must keep watch, because, like servants not knowing when the lord of the house will return, we don't want to be asleep when we should be ready to receive him. Paul assures the Corinthians that they "are not lacking in any spiritual gift" as they wait. Let the word of God inspire us to prepare our hearts for his arrival.

<u>STEWARDSHIP</u>: The good steward is always expected to have the affairs of the master in order at all times. There is no time for complacency. Stewardship of time entails a readiness to serve others and a vigilance in that service.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Advent is my favorite Liturgical Season of the year. The sense of anticipation and joy that is part of the celebration and the themes of being prepared, staying awake and looking forward to what is to come is an exciting experience. The candle lights of the Advent Wreath each week chases away the darkening of each day – until all are lit and the Light of the World breaks forth like a New Dawn.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How can I give control over to God?
