



Dear Friends,

Living in an age well before the internet or social media, the Magi from the East relied upon a single star as a sign that a king had been born. The heavens revealed to these learned foreigners that a matter of great import had occurred in Judea. Today we celebrate the revelation of the birth of our Lord to the outside world, to us. The light over the little town of Bethlehem has revealed the light of the world to the ends of the earth.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Every Epiphany we hear the endless extent of God's goodness. Isaiah tells of the light shining forth from Jerusalem attracting people from near and far, from land and sea. The psalmist sings of eternal justice and peace leading all nations to adore the Lord. Paul teaches the Ephesians that they, and all Gentiles, are members of the same body of Christ. Matthew writes of the Magi from afar being drawn to the newborn king by the light from above. Let us look for that revelatory light that draws us more fully to the Lord.

<u>STEWARDSHIP:</u> Opening their coffers was part of the prayer of the Magi. Becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ has its beginning in baptism, the sacrament of faith. Faith joins individuals and the community of Jesus' followers in intimacy with their Lord and leads them to live as His disciples. Stewardship is what we do after we say we believe. How often do we open our coffers to those around us who are in need?

A REMINDER: Epiphany is known in the Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Rite Churches as "Little Christmas" and is celebrated with even more festivity and solemnity then we celebrate Christmas in the West. It is an acknowledgement of the revelation of Christ "the Light of the World" to the Gentiles. Those who are truly "wise" will follow His Star! As we have also begun a New Year, 2021, on January 1, let us use the lessons and challenges that were taught us in 2020 to grow stronger and deeper in faith.

<u>A OUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> The magi's encounter with Christ leads them to change the course of their journey. How is my journey changed by my encounter with the Lord?
