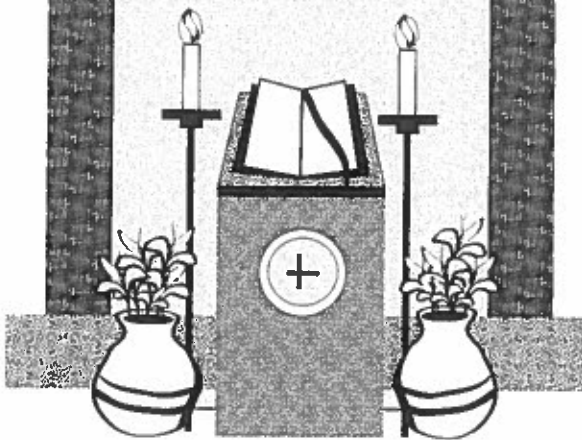

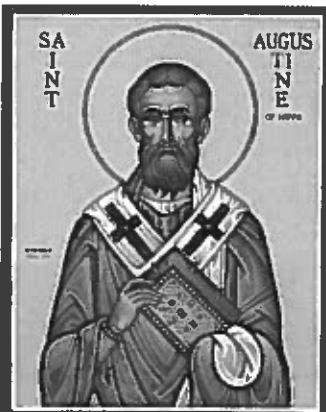
**Reconciliation:** Seasonal penance services offered throughout the year, on Saturday at 3:30 pm at St. Augustine Church or by appointment at any time.

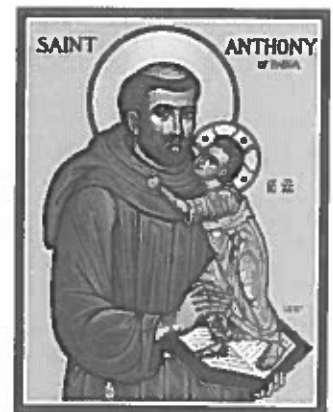

Dear Friends,

We begin Catholic Schools Week today. You may not have a child in Catholic school or even have a child of school age, but that does not mean that this week is not important to you, too. Catholic education is a key way we transmit our faith, beliefs, and traditions onto the next generation, as well as teaching reading and math and all the subjects that our young ones need to succeed and contribute to society. Coming together today to worship, let us recall those who have taught us - our parents, teachers, other family members, priests, sisters, and brothers - and thank them for the worlds they have opened to us.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** God has blessed us with many leaders who have brought God's word to the people. Moses promised the Chosen People that God would raise up a prophet among them who would speak God's words. Saint Paul was called by God to preach to Gentiles all over the known world. Jesus spoke words with the power to drive out unclean spirits, astonishing the people in the synagogue with his authority. Let us listen attentively to the living word of God and hear Jesus' voice still speaking to us in our house of worship.

**STEWARDSHIP:** Medical surveys correlating physical health and social activities consistently attest that those who perform regular volunteer work have death rates two and one-half times lower than those who do not. The surest way to be free of all worries is to invest our time and talent in the service of others.

**A REMINDER:** We are so fortunate in our little cluster to have a Catholic Grade School (and at one time three), a Catholic High School and three Catholic Churches within the confines of a rural setting. Not only that but you also add a Catholic Hospital and I don't believe that there is any other place in the United States that has such a Catholic presence and identity with a comparable size. The expression "you can't see the forest for the trees" might really apply here. During this Catholic Schools Week celebration: "Faith - Excellence - Service" is a theme we can really see in action.

**A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:** What unclean spirits need to be driven out of my life? How can Jesus, within me and among us, defeat them?

**EXTENSIVE CURRICULUM** Our extensive, multi-level curriculum provides all students, including those needing academic accommodations, with the opportunity both to challenge themselves and to achieve success.

### TECHNOLOGY

**Bring Your Own Device Program** For academic purposes, students may utilize the electronic device of their choice, as well as the school-wide Wi-Fi.

**Electronic Learning** When necessary, including on "snow days," students electronically attend live-streamed classes via Microsoft Teams.

**Electronic Textbooks (e-books)** The use of e-books has been implemented in numerous courses.

**PlusPortals** Our interactive web portal provides students and parents with academic, attendance, and discipline reports, as well as general school information.

**Microsoft Office 365** Students receive a Mater Dei email address and a license to utilize Microsoft Office 365 products on their device(s).

**PREPARATION FOR COLLEGE** Our College Placement Director provides information and workshops related to the college placement process, including preparing for the ACT and SAT, searching for and applying to colleges, applying for scholarships and financial aid, and NCAA eligibility. In addition, we host a College Fair and offer an ACT prep course taught by our faculty members.

### CLASS OF 2020 HIGHLIGHTS

**Average ACT Score** The average of the ACT composite scores is 23.5.

**ACT Composite Scores of 24 or Higher** The top forty-two ACT composite scores (47%) are all 24 or higher and have an average of 27.9.

**ACT Composite Scores of 27 or Higher** The top twenty-five ACT composite scores (27%) are all 27 or higher and have an average of 30.

**ACT Composite Scores of 30 or Higher** The top eleven ACT composite scores (12%) are all 30 or higher and have an average of 32.3

**Illinois State Scholars** The average of the ACT composite scores for the seventeen Illinois State Scholars is 30.

## KNIGHTS SERVE

### LEARNING OUR FAITH

Students enroll in a theology course each semester and participate in a day of retreat, with their class, each year.

We welcome students of other faith traditions, who currently represent nearly 12% of our student body.

### LOVING OUR FAITH

For our masses, students serve as ushers, servers, musicians, and lectors.

The Class of 2021 also includes eight catechists who serve YFF/PSR programs at local parishes and seventeen extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.

### LIVING OUR FAITH

**Missions and Special Collections** During the 2019-2020 school year, our students, faculty, and staff donated nearly \$13,600 in support of class missions and special causes.

### Service

Students provide service both as a school community and as individuals. Underclass students complete twelve hours of service each year, and seniors complete a three-week service project.

### Liturgical Opportunities

Students participate in Mass and prayer both as a school community (seven Masses and daily prayer) and in their theology classes.

During Lent, we offer daily Eucharist services and a reconciliation service.
