





Dear Friends,

Even during Lent, we remain a joyful people, for we believe that God loves us despite our sinfulness, loves us so much that Jesus Christ sacrificed himself so that we may be redeemed and born into eternal life. Today on *Laetare* ("Rejoice") Sunday, we anticipate the joy we will feel on Easter. Let us give thanks to God for the grace and mercy we have regularly received and trust we will continue to receive throughout our lives.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: The readings today begin with a chronicle of the downfall of Judah, though it does have a note of hope at the end. Saint Paul teaches the Ephesians that Jesus Christ is proof positive of God's rich mercy. In the Gospel, Jesus tells Nicodemus that he will be lifted up by his Father, bringing eternal life to all who believe. God's unending love is a source of hope, mercy, and life. Let us rejoice!

<u>STEWARDSHIP</u>: What greater gift could God have given us than to sacrifice Jesus Christ so that we may enjoy eternal life? God asks so little of us in return. Our natural response, out of gratitude to God, is to give of ourselves and to sacrifice some of our time and resources to help others.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: Our Spiritual Ashes of our Lenten Journey call us to Reconciliation, Renewal and Reform. On Thursday of this week we will celebrate the Parish Partnership Lenten Reconciliation Service at St. Dominic Church at 7pm. "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How does the undeserved mercy God shows me inform the way I treat those who have wronged me or those whom I see as sinners?

(Matt 1:24) "It was grace that moved Joseph to embrace his vocation as the guardian of Israel's Messiah. It's the same grace that empowers us to accept God's call and wisdom for our lives. Joseph's yes in faith changed the world. God also has a plan for your life. You don't know where your yes might lead and how God might use it. Ask Joseph to help. Then, like Joseph, go out in faith to be a "doer of the word" (James 1:2d2d)." (The Word Among Us)

While Fridays in Lent normally are a day of abstinence from meat for Catholics, canon law provides an exception for solemnities that fall on a Friday. The Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 19) will be on a Friday this year; therefore, Catholics are not obligated to maintain the usual Lenten abstinence on Friday, March 19, 2021.
