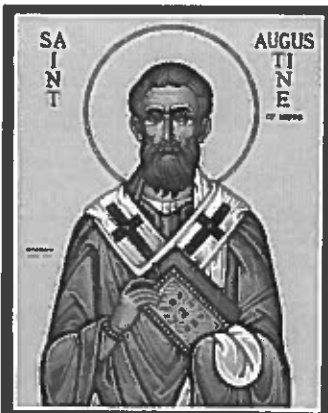
Reconciliation: Seasonal penance services offered throughout the year, on Saturday at 3:30 pm at St. Augustine Church or by appointment at any time.

We invite everyone 18 or older to register at the office as adults.

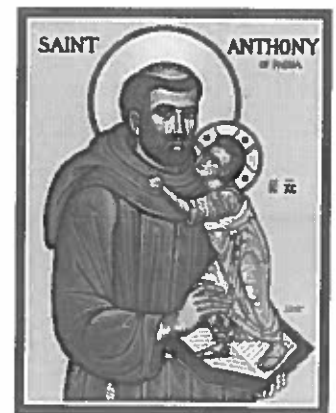

Dear Friends,

Holding our blessed palms and shouting hosannas, today we commemorate Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. We do so with a note of melancholy, for we know that his arrival is also his entrance into the dark days of abandonment, agony, and death. However, we know that in the end God will triumph and sin, darkness, and even death will be defeated. Confident in Jesus' redemptive power, we raise our voices in love and thanksgiving.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Today's first reading foreshadows what comes later. Isaiah's Suffering Servant continues to preach to those who are weary and hopeless despite the abuse he receives from his adversaries. Saint Paul, in the second reading, attests to Jesus' sacrifice and victory. In the Passion, we hear Saint Mark's account of Jesus' final hours before his death on the cross. Listening to the word of God today, let us echo the words of the centurion upon Jesus' death: "Truly this man was the Son of God!"

STEWARDSHIP: In order to have Christ's attitude, we must deny ourselves and take up our crosses daily to follow Him. The Lord's way is not always a comfortable lifestyle. It calls us to put aside our cravings for domination, possession and control. Yet, if we empty ourselves and humbly accept God's will, God promises that we will be transformed with Christ.

A REMINDER: This week we enter into the most solemn of all weeks in the Liturgical Calendar: Holy Week. Please check the Parish Partnership Schedule for all the Services that will be offered in our Partnership each day. Easter is not just a single day, but must be celebrated within the context of the days leading up to it.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What cross do I find difficult to shoulder myself? Whose burden have I been unwilling to share? How can I help someone else and/or allow myself to be helped?

Years later, after my family settled in the United States, I became a lost sheep on a college campus. In 2008, I began to go to daily Mass, participated in Eucharistic adoration, and found a spiritual director. My discernment journey took me to many communities until, in 2010, I knew that the Lord was asking me to say "yes" to him through the Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Church."
