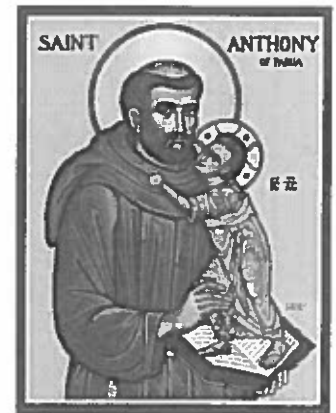
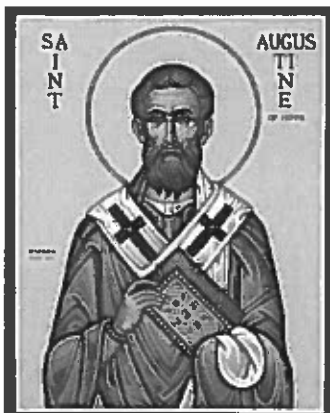

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples to remain in his love just as he remains in his Father's love. Love is a bond between them that lasts forever. For many of us, the first lasting bond we formed was with our mothers. We honor them today, and all who have acted as mothers in our lives, recognizing that they likely taught us what love was. May that bond teach us now how to remain in Christ's love.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Our readings today move us from acceptance to love. Peter points out that the Holy Spirit comes to Gentiles and Jews alike, preaching that God does not discriminate. John calls on us to love one another, for God is love. Jesus, on the night before he was put to death, tells his disciples that there is no greater love than laying down one's life for others. Let us listen to these lessons of grace-filled tolerance and selfless love.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus' disciples and Christian stewards recognize God as the origin of life, giver of freedom, and source of all things. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and are eager to use them to show our love for God and for one another. We look to the life and teaching of Jesus for guidance in living as Christian Stewards.

A REMINDER: On this Mother's Day weekend, let us be grateful to our Heavenly Father for having gifted us with our Mothers and let us pray for them, living and deceased. We are also grateful to the Holy Name and its members who helped cook and serve the Mother's Day Drive-through Breakfast.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How am I being called to sacrifice my own priorities in order to serve others?
