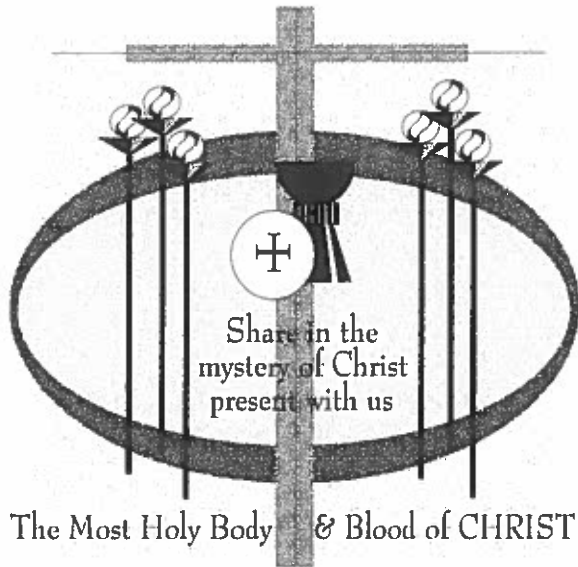

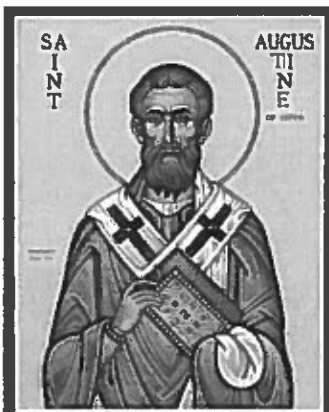
Reconciliation: Seasonal penance services offered throughout the year, on Saturday at 3:30 pm at St. Augustine Church or by appointment at any time.

We invite everyone 18 or older to register at the office as adults.

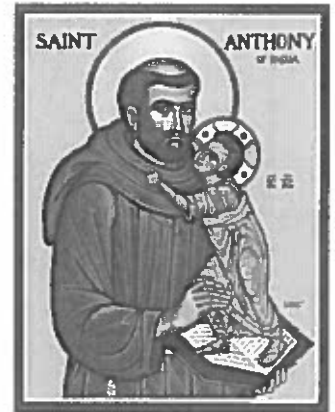

Dear Friends,

Every time we gather for the Eucharist, we offer simple gifts of bread and wine that become Christ's Body and Blood for all to share. These basic staples of food and drink that we bring to the table become the flesh and blood of our Savior. His Body and Blood nourish us as we carry out his mission. Most of us realize now how much we miss receiving the Eucharist for an extended period of time. Therefore, let us approach the table of the Lord today in joy and gratitude for God's abiding presence in this sacred meal.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Blood was used by Moses and the Chosen People to seal the covenant God has made with them. Centuries later, Jesus used his own blood-the blood he offered his disciples, the blood he would freely shed on the cross-to seal the new covenant he made with those in need of redemption, with all of us. In today's psalm we sing together, "I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord." As we deepen our appreciation of the blood we share, let us commit to taking the cup Jesus offers us and calling upon the name of the Lord.

STEWARDSHIP: Christians bring to the Eucharist their lives as disciples of Jesus and the stewardship they have exercised regarding them and their individual contributions to the great work of Christ. The Eucharist is not only the promise but the commencement of the heavenly banquet which we shall share, enjoying the fruits of stewardship freed of stain, burnished and transfigured.

A REMINDER: The Eucharist is at the very heart and soul of a Faith Community. During this time of pandemic, so many have not had the opportunity to receive Jesus in the Real Presence – rather have depended on a "Spiritual Communion". As restrictions relax and as more individuals are immunized – let us pray that our parishioners will return to Mass to be nourished with the Bread of Life.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How will the Body and Blood of Christ that I receive today make a difference in what I say and do this week?

We will have **2 softball teams** this year; we are **looking for an adult to help coach (supervise)** at the games. Games will begin in June and will be once a week.

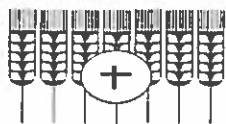
