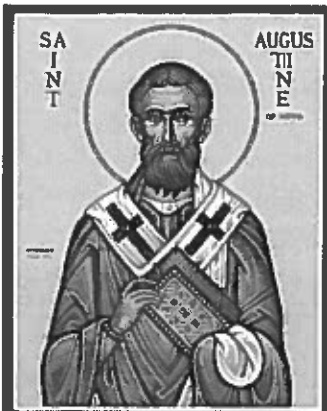
Reconciliation: Seasonal penance services offered throughout the year, on Saturday at 3:30 pm at St. Augustine Church or by appointment at any time.

We invite everyone 18 or older to register at the office as adults.

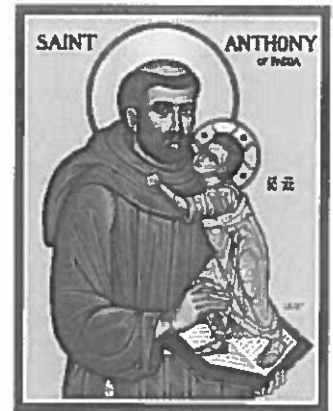

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, people from towns all over Galilee hurried to see and hear Jesus. His heart was moved, for they appeared to be "sheep without a shepherd." Jesus is that shepherd. Jesus is *our* shepherd. He has drawn us here today, from different households, from different families, perhaps even from different towns. We come today to celebrate the Eucharist, this wonderful sacrament that Jesus established to be celebrated in his name until the end of time, this sacrament in which we receive our Lord, our redeemer, our shepherd.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: In the Gospel we hear today, Jesus invites his disciples to take a break and rest a while. He invites us to do the same today. As we rest our minds and bodies, let us listen to God's word. Jeremiah tells his people that one day a king and shepherd will come to bring justice to the land. Paul writes that in Christ walls are broken down and peace established among all peoples. Jesus laments the directionless people massed on the shore. And so he began to teach. May we be eager learners.

STEWARDSHIP: In today's gospel, Jesus had planned to slip away and rest. When He saw the people gathered, however, He put his needs aside to meet the needs of others. As stewards, we are called to do the same.

A REMINDER: Midway through Summer, let us pause and consider how well we have also spent some Spiritual growth time amid our relaxation, vacation and fun-time.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: When has my compassion for someone or for others pushed aside my own needs? How can I put others' needs first more often?

"Sister parishes from the United States, in the midst of their pain, kept our parishes open in Jalapa, Jutiapa, Izabal, and Peten." Padre Teodoro Beltran pastor at Santa Catarina Martir

On my recent trip to Guatemala, I was given the opportunity to meet with the bishops of Jalapa, Jutiapa, Izabal, and Peten. It is such a blessing to be with the priests and bishops of these dioceses of Guatemala. I can't even begin to express the overwhelming joy of being able to sit and talk with the pastors of your sister parishes. They are so grateful and although it is difficult to describe the feelings of appreciation they gave; I will try my best. In a meeting with the priests and bishops, Padre Teodoro, pastor for the sister parish of Carlyle, stood up and began to thank me and his sister parish for their support during Covid. What everyone needs to understand is not only were their churches closed much longer than ours, but the priests do not get paid. They rely on the donations, money or food, from their parishioners to survive. Without contact with parishioners, the pastors of our sister parishes were left with little resources. As Padre Teodoro continued to express his gratitude, I wished that all parishes in the United States could hear his authentic thanksgiving for his sister parish. After he finished his expression of thanks, one by one all the other pastors stood and stated that they too gave thanks to God for their brothers and sisters in their sister parishes. The pastors of Guatemala were amazed that during our struggle we continue to support them. This was a true act of love, just as Jesus would do. I could feel in my heart their loving gratitude and continued prayerful support of all of us. **THANK YOU.**—Shelly Sand, Missions International
