




Dear Friends,

Today is World Mission Sunday, when we focus on the mission of the Church, which is to bring the Good News to the whole world. When we think of missionaries, we think of men and women who have dedicated their lives to bringing the gospel to people in Third World countries. But we are all missionaries, witnessing by our own lives to the good news we have come to know in the Lord. Let us recommit ourselves to that mission as we celebrate the Eucharist.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Whereas last Sunday the readings focused on the trials and sufferings of our Lord and the service to which we are all called, today's readings celebrate the joy that our faith in God brings. Jeremiah tells how God will gather the Chosen People from the ends of the earth. Hebrews reminds us that God calls all who lead the church, and in fact sent the great high priest, Jesus Christ, into the world. In the Gospel, Jesus heals blind Bartimaeus, who leaves his former way of life behind to follow Jesus. May we be blessed with his courage.

STEWARDSHIP: The Preparation of the Gifts is a significant part of the Eucharistic celebration. When we bring to the altar the bread and wine, along with the good works and services we have performed and our contribution of treasure, we are in communion with all of our brothers and sisters, offering our God-given gifts.

A REMINDER: The United States is a "Mission" country. Where once we sent missionaries to far-away lands to evangelize, now we are the recipients of hundreds of religious men and women who are coming here to staff our parishes and schools. The Belleville Diocese is one of a growing number of "Mission Dioceses" in the United States. A fact that may surprise you is: "Catholics living in most of the territory of the U.S. are actually shepherded by a Catholic home mission diocese." (source USCCB). Let us be grateful for the "*Fidei Donum*" **priests who currently serve in our diocese** without whom parishes would be underserved or closed and the number of parishes each priest would be responsible for would exceed four.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What aspect of my life needs healing? What do I want Jesus to do for me?

Each October the Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month. We have an opportunity to help the Pregnancy Care Clinics at Centralia and Salem with a Pro Life Baby Shower as they care for the Mothers and their Babies by donating baby items or cash. 
