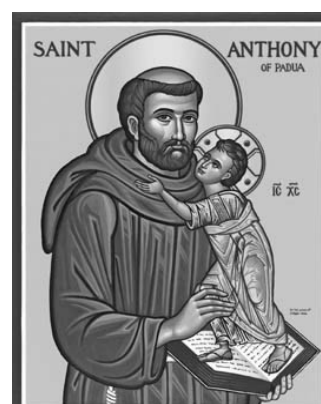
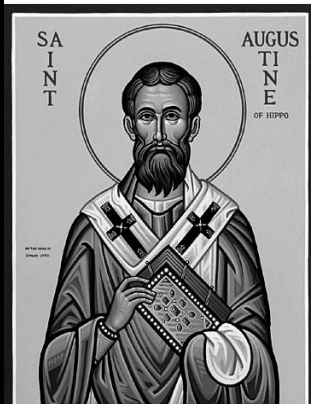

Dear Friends,

Tomorrow we celebrate the solemnity of All Saints, when we recognize those many men and women who we believe have gained the eternal reward and are forever in the presence of God. Today we hear Jesus tell a scribe, "You are not far from the kingdom of God," suggesting that this anonymous functionary was close to being a saint. To be a saint should be our goal, so let us listen to the Gospel and pray that we take Jesus' words to heart and put them into action.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** Moses knew the power of God, since it flowed through him as he led the Chosen People out of captivity and toward a land flowing with milk and honey. Therefore, he enthusiastically exhorted his people to love God with all their heart, soul, and strength. Jesus repeats this directive in (he Gospel, adding its complement: love your neighbor as yourself. Let us embrace these commandments as the foundation of our life.

**STEWARDSHIP:** The life of a Christian steward models the life of Jesus. It is challenging and even difficult, in many respects, yet intense joy comes to those who take the risk to live as Christian stewards. We demonstrate our love for God by our love for our neighbor. Stewardship calls us to serve one another through love ... bearing one another's burdens and therefore fulfilling Jesus' commandment.

**A REMINDER:** This weekend on Sunday at both parishes we remember those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith (13 from St. Anthony and 13 from St. Augustine). May they rest in the peace of Christ and may their memory be a blessing for their families.

**A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:** Do I think Jesus would tell me that I am "not far from the kingdom of God?" What should I do to become closer?
