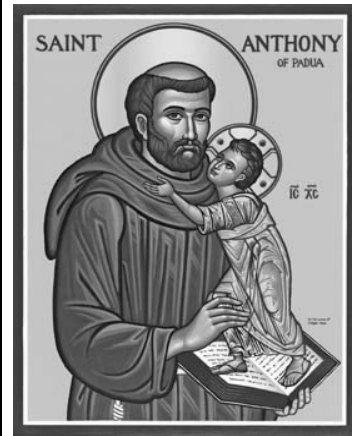
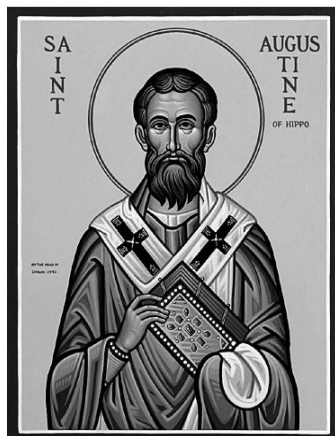

Dear Friends,

Today we recognize Jesus' role as the Lord of all, the ruler over all humanity, the king of the eternal heavenly kingdom. To his followers, Jesus referred to this kingdom as the kingdom of God or his Father's kingdom, but through his ultimate act of self-sacrifice he became the firstborn of this kingdom, ready to show us the way. Let us pray that when our day comes, we will be found worthy and ready for the kingdom.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Throughout history Jesus Christ has been acknowledged as King. Even before he was born to Mary, Daniel prophesied that one like a Son of man would come from heaven to earth and be regarded as King and Lord. The author of Revelation calls him the faithful witness of the kingdom. In the Gospel we hear him witness to the kingdom in front of Pilate. That scene gives us an insight into his kingship, which is anchored in the truth, and to which he testified during his entire time on earth. Let us open our hearts to the truth, which continues to be revealed by Christ the King.

STEWARDSHIP: We serve Christ by opening our hearts and hands to one another. Stewardship calls us to a life of service. This service may take many forms; visiting the elderly, feeding the poor, comforting the sick, welcoming strangers

A REMINDER: This week we pause to give special thanks for God's most abundant graces and blessings in our lives. There is an Ecumenical Service at St. Anthony on Tuesday evening at 7pm. St. Augustine will have their Thanksgiving Mass on Wednesday at 7pm and St. Anthony on Thursday at 8:30am. May we be like the Samaritan leper who returned after discovering that he was healed and not like the nine others who either didn't care, couldn't be bothered or didn't even notice how God had worked His love in them.
