



Dear Friends.

Advent is a time to prepare for the coming of the Lord, whom we portray as a precious infant in a simple manger at the end of this season. But there are two more arrivals of our Lord to contemplate during this season of preparation and they tend to be overlooked. One day Jesus Christ will come again in glory as the world ends and he delivers his final judgment. He gives a glimpse of this to his disciples in today's Gospel. But let us also consider his third appearance-to each of us personally, into our hearts and into our lives as we embrace him as his disciples. As we celebrate today, let us consider how we can welcome him ever more intimately into our lives.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Today's readings focus on two comings of Jesus: as the fulfillment of God's promise to the Chosen People and as judge at the end of time. The prophet Jeremiah and the apostle Paul offer words of hope and encouragement to their people as they anticipate these events. In the meantime, Paul advises the Thessalonians, they should act even more out of love for one another. May these words serve to prepare us as well during this holy season of expectation.

STEWARDSHIP: Intense joy comes to those who take the risk to live as Christian stewards. Central to our human and Christian vocations, as well as to the unique vocation each one of us receives from God, is that we be good stewards of the gifts we possess. God gives us this divine-human workshop, this world and Church of ours. The Spirit shows us the way. Stewardship is a part of that journey.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: This weekend begins the *Awesome Season of Advent*, as well as, a new Church Calendar Year. It is Cycle C and when Ordinary Time begins in January, we will hear most of the Gospels read for the weekend from Saint Luke. The Advent wreath which we will be lighting each of the four weeks of Advent, actually has its origins with our Lutheran brethren from eastern Germany. The symbolism of the increasing candle light with the decreasing sunlight gives witness to the birth of Christ, the Light of the World, and the Winter Solstice with the return of an increasing sunlight.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> Can I name a person or group of people whom I now realize I have overlooked? How can I seek out Jesus in my neighbor?
