





Dear Friends,

On this midwinter day, cold and snow-covered across much of the continent, the Holy Spirit draws us here together through a shared hunger for a life in the Lord that can overcome the hardships of our lives. Our sensory hunger and physical hunger are joined by a spiritual hunger. We hunger for the word of God to guide us and for the Eucharist to nourish us. Jesus tells us that those who are now hungry will be satisfied. May that comfort us as we hunger for light, for warmth, for guidance, for nourishment, for eternal life in the Lord.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Jeremiah explains that those who trust in the LORD will bear fruit like a tree planted beside gentle waters. Paul teaches that because Christ was raised from the dead, we can hope in our own resurrection. Jesus preaches that those who suffer now will be rewarded in time. Listening to God's word today, let us find hope in the promises of the Lord.

STEWARDSHIP: Baptism empowers Christians to become stewards by grace: able to act explicitly on God's behalf in cultivating and serving the portion of the world entrusted to their care. Part of what is involved here for Catholics is a stewardship of time, which should include setting aside periods for family prayer, for the reading of Scripture, for visits to the Blessed Sacrament, and for attendance at Mass during the week whenever possible.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: This Sunday, February 13, is World Marriage Day, sponsored by Worldwide Marriage Encounter. See their informative website: <u>wmd.wwme.org</u>. The Sacrament of Matrimony expresses the Covenant of Love between Himself and all His children. Having given them a co-share in the creative act of bringing life into the world, the bond between wife and husband, shows forth that sacredness and sanctity.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What part of my life am I complacent about? How do the Beatitudes call me to change?
