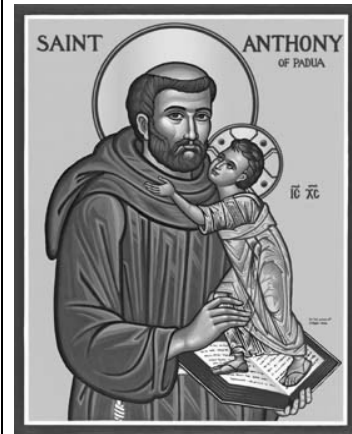
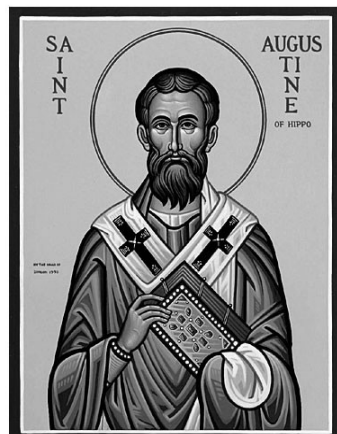

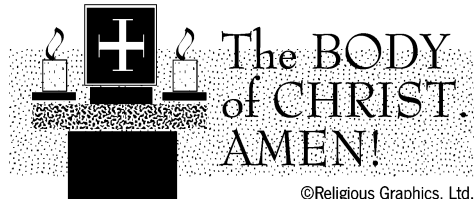

Dear Friends,

We undergo numerous trials in our lives. A loved one is rolled into surgery, we are laid off from work, a friend invites us to participate in something we know is unethical. All difficult situations, all occasions we feel we cannot face alone. We hope to turn to God, trusting that the Lord will accompany us during our moment of need. Our faith in God enables us to face these times of stress, to look to the Lord for strength to handle trauma, resist temptation, and hope in eternal life. Joined with family, friends, and neighbors, let us turn to the Lord with confidence and trust as we celebrate this liturgy.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Moses speaks to an assembly of the people in today's first reading, reminding them that God heard their pleas in Egypt and saved them from captivity, bringing them through the desert to a land of plenty. Paul teaches the Romans that anyone can be saved by their faith that God has raised Jesus from the dead. In the Gospel, Jesus is tempted by the devil in the desert, resisting every temptation he faces by relying on the word of God. May we too be strengthened by God's word.

STEWARDSHIP: Many of us have been adversely influenced by today's secular culture. We know what it is to struggle against selfishness and greed. Our vocation of Christian discipleship requires an openness to the Holy Spirit and obedience to God's Word in the ongoing struggle of conversion. Each of us must discern, accept and live out joyfully and generously the commitments, responsibilities, and roles to which God calls him or her.

A REMINDER: We have entered our Journey of Lent marked with the "Spiritual Ashes" of our commitment "to turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel". May our steps take us through our desert of denial and sacrifice so as to reach the Oasis of Easter and the cooling and refreshing Waters of New Birth.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What specifically will I do this Lent to take the focus off myself and put it on God and on others?

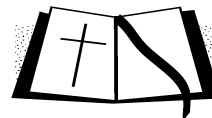
