



The Holy Spirit draws us here today to worship our Lord, to listen to God's word, and to celebrate the Eucharist. On this holiday weekend, as we recognize the blessings of human labor and of all those who work, whether they are paid or unpaid, we are also inspired to take part in the Lord's work. May this Eucharist strengthen us as we labor in the vineyard, helping to bring Christ's saving message to a hungry world.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Jesus has a sobering, even shocking, warning to would-be disciples in today's Gospel. In uncompromising language he tells the crowds that whoever wishes to be his disciple must make a total commitment. After all, the apostles left behind their families, their homes, and all their possessions to follow Jesus. As we look at our own commitment from a different perspective, let us pray for the grace to be worthy disciples of the Lord.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus' invitation to follow Him is addressed to us. We are Catholic citizens of a wealthy, powerful nation facing many questions about its identity and role in the 21st Century. We are members of a community of faith blessed with many human and material resources yet often uncertain about how to sustain and use them. Stewardship is a disciple's response. **A REMINDER:** Monday is Labor Day and we turn to the Lord and ask his blessings upon the work of our hands. It is indeed a strange time in the labor force with such an unusual changeover of jobs, more job openings then applicants and yet an unemployment rate that is 3.5% with the number of unemployed listed as 5.4 million (July 2022 statistics). Something for Economics to ponder and debate.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK</u>: How strong is my commitment to being a disciple? What am I willing to give up and what am I willing to accept?
