Dear Friends,

The Holy Spirit draws our community to this place each Sunday, where we encounter Christ in the word of God, in the Eucharist, and in each other. This weekly celebration of the Mass is the center of the Church's life, and it renews and strengthens us in our faith and our mission. Nourished by Christ's body and this gathering of the body of Christ, may we go forth and give witness to our faith.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** Persistence is the word of the day today, as each reading teaches the importance of persistence in carrying out God's will. In Exodus, Moses must persist in raising his arms and holding the staff of God in order for Joshua to defeat the enemy in battle. Paul instructs Timothy to be persistent even when it's inconvenient. Jesus' parable features a widow who successfully influences a dishonest judge to render a just verdict because of her persistence. May God's word inspire us to persist in doing what is right without giving up.

**STEWARDSHIP:** It does not require great faith to share material resources with others and with your parish when you are certain there is enough money for family needs and wants. However, it takes a person of deep faith to give when financial resources are uncertain. Yet God promises that He will never be outdone in generosity.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: I have shared with you that only 40% of Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. If this does not disturb you, you are missing the impact that this has on the Church today. The Eucharist is not merely a memorial of the Last Supper it is as the Catechism of the Church teaches, the unbloody sacrifice of Jesus given for us just as he died on the Cross for us. His words are real "This is My Body, this is My Blood given for you" – He is truly present in the bread and wine once Consecrated – that is the Real Presence.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK</u>: For what do I feel I am praying in vain? Can I find the will to pray for it persistently? Meanwhile, how can I be part of God's answer to someone else's persistent prayer?


