

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, Zacchaeus has to climb a tree in order to see Jesus. We likely had it much easier to come here today to encounter our Lord. We don't have to go up a tree; we experience Jesus' presence right here and right now in the company of other believers, in the hearing of God's word, and in the Eucharist itself. At the end of the Gospel, Jesus tells the repentant Zacchaeus that salvation has come to his house. May the Lord's mercy bring salvation to this house as well.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Today's first reading begins with the wonderful image of the whole universe in God's eyes being like a single drop of morning dew upon the earth. The author of Wisdom goes on to extol the LORD's mercy, which descends upon us all, cleansing and refreshing us much as the morning dew does to all living things. We hear Saint Paul's words of reassurance to the early Christian community in Thessalonica. In the Gospel, Zacchaeus climbs a tree in order to see Jesus on his way to Jerusalem. May God's word renew and refresh us like the morning dew!

STEWARDSHIP: The Holy Spirit freely gives each of us different gifts, and Jesus encounters us within the culture within which we live. Zacchaeus gives half his belongings to the poor and is promised salvation. Yet elsewhere, Jesus tells the rich young man that he must sell everything, and the great crowd that "none of you can be my disciple if he does not renounce all his possessions." Each of us has been uniquely gifted and we will have to account for our use of our gifts to spread God's kingdom within our American culture.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: On Sunday, at both parishes (10 from St. Anthony and 12 from St. Augustine), we are remembering the deceased parishioners who have gone before us marked with the sign of peace since last year. May they rest in the peace of Christ and may their memories be a blessing for their families. Tuesday is a Holyday of Obligation celebrating All Saints Day. See Mass schedule for times.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK</u>: If I were in Zacchaeus's shoes and Jesus was coming to my home while others called me a sinner, what wrongs would I pledge to make right? What bold promises would I make?
