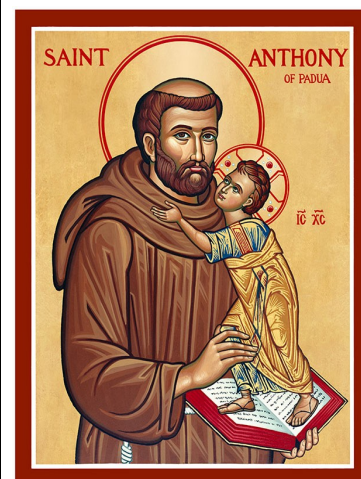

Dear Friends,

May we always honor that sense of the "sanctity" of nature by our own stewardship of conservation and resourcefulness.
