



Dear Friends,

Today we acknowledge that while leaders of nations in this world come and go, Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is ruler over all people both now and forever. The idea to celebrate this feast was born out of a growing nationalism and secularism one hundred years ago. The world had just lived through the horrors of four years of war unprecedented in its spread over the whole world. This led to Pope Pius XI instituting this feast in 1925. Today we recognize Christ's preeminence and pray for the day when peace and goodwill forever overcome war and aggression.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: In the first reading, we hear of the moment when David, supported by all the tribes of Israel, was anointed king. Paul praises Jesus as head of the church and firstborn of the dead, ruler over the heavenly kingdom. Luke tells us that as Jesus hung on the cross he promised a place in heaven to the penitent thief. As we listen to God's word, let us pray that Jesus remembers us as well in his heavenly kingdom.

STEWARDSHIP: To the world it is a paradox that Christians are called to follow the poor Christ, the humble and cross-bearing Christ, in order to be made worthy of being partakers in His glory. As His disciples and stewards, we should walk unhesitatingly according to our own personal gifts and duties in the path of a living faith which arouses hope and works through charity.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: This week we celebrate Thanksgiving. A great time to share with family and friends the many blessings which God has bestowed upon us and to be grateful in heart for those blessings. Next weekend we begin the new Mass schedule for the Partnership: on Saturday 4pm at St. Augustine and 5:30pm at St. Dominic and on Sunday 8am at St. Augustine, 9:30am at St. Anthony and 11am at St. Dominic. Your understanding and cooperation will greatly assist in making this transition as smooth as possible.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK</u>: Who can I forgive this week, imitating the Lord's mercy, sowing the seeds of the kingdom, and bringing a sort of paradise to someone else's heart?
