





With great longing, we have been preparing our hearts and our homes for this day on which we celebrate the birth of our Messiah and Savior. We recall that glorious night when the Blessed Mother bore Jesus into an expectant world, realizing that Jesus is also born in our hearts and in our world here and now, made present through one another and in the Eucharist we celebrate. May this "good news of great joy that will be for all the people" continue to be incarnated in our lives and our world.

<u>THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON</u>: Isaiah prophesied that the LORD would proclaim that a savior would come and a people would be redeemed. On the night Jesus was born, the shepherds are the first to hear this proclamation. At once they go to Bethlehem. They find Mary, Joseph, and the infant, and they repeat the angels' message. When they leave, they glorify and praise God. May we accompany the shepherds this morning, find Jesus born in our midst, and give praise and thanks to God.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus is the supreme teacher of Christian stewardship, as He is of every other aspect of Christian life. In Jesus' teaching and life, self-emptying is fundamental. Jesus sets aside self; He is filled with the Father's will and He is fulfilled in just this way: "My food is to do the will of the one who sent Me and to finish His work" (In 4:34) Jesus' mission is to restore to good order the created household of God which sin has disrupted. He not only perfectly accomplishes this task, but also, in calling disciples, empowers them to collaborate with Him in the work of redemption for themselves and on behalf of others.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: I wish to extend to each and every one of you and your families and loved one a Blessed Christmas as we celebrate the Gift of the Father's Love: the Birth of Jesus, Our Lord and Savior.


