

Dear Friends,

We greet the Lord today with palm branches and hosannas, welcoming him to the holy city of Jerusalem. His missionary journey and our Lenten journey are nearing their completion. Soon Jesus will celebrate the Passover with his closest disciples here in the center of the Jewish world. Before the sun rises, he will be betrayed by one of his friends, arrested, and taken away. He will be tortured, put on trial, and sentenced to death. He will die on the cross, be taken down, and be buried. From there he will be raised and will ascend to the holy city that is our eternal home. Today, as we shout our hosannas and wave our palm branches to welcome our Lord into Jerusalem, we look forward to the day when we will all be welcomed into the new Jerusalem.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Jesus calls out near the point of death. Centuries earlier, the psalmist had cried out to God with the same words. One can imagine Isaiah saying the same thing as he was struck and beaten by his oppressors. Through all their suffering, none of them rebel or fight back. Though in tremendous pain hanging limply on the cross, Jesus remained obedient to the end. Let us listen to St. Matthew's Passion, realizing what our Lord endured to win our salvation.

STEWARDSHIP: Participation in Christ's redemptive activity extends even, though certainly not only, to the use we make of experiences that otherwise might seem the least promising: deprivation, loss, pain. "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake," St. Paul says, "and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church" (Col 1 :24). Here also we look to Jesus to lead the way. For our estimate of suffering, as St. Pope John Paul II pointed out, is transformed by discovering its "salvific meaning" when united with the suffering of Christ (Salvifici Doloris, 27)

<u>A REMINDER</u>: As we entry into the holiest of weeks in the Christian Liturgical calendar, we begin our liturgy with the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem only to be reminded in the second Gospel for this Mass of the rejection and denial of Christ which led to His death on the Cross. Let us take time to journey with Jesus during this Holy Week and come back at Easter with a greater appreciation of the unconditional Love that God show us.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK</u>: In whom am I challenged to see Jesus? How can I help carry Christ's cross by carrying my neighbor's cross?
