



Dear Friends,

We hear the Chosen People grumble in today's first reading, for they are thirsty and have no idea how long their journey through the desert will last. "Is the LORD in our midst or not?" they complain. Here in this place, where we gather with God's people to worship the Lord, to listen to God's word, and to receive the Lord's body and blood, we can be assured that the Lord is in our midst. Jesus has quenched our deepest thirst with living water, with water welling up to eternal life. Together let us give witness to our faith that God remains always in our midst.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** The woman in today's Gospel comes to the well to draw water, some-thing she had probably done every day of her life as far back as she could remember. But on this day she encounters the Messiah and her whole life changes. We have an opportunity right now to encounter the Lord in the word of God. May our lives be changed by the words we hear today.

STEWARDSHIP: Through penance voluntarily accepted we gradually become liberated from obstacles to Christian discipleship. Our secularized culture exalts individual gratification, not just the quest for pleasure but avarice, a craving for the illusion of absolute dominion and control, valuing creatures without reference to their Creator; excessive individualism; and ultimately the fear of death unrelieved by hope for eternal life. These consequences of sin threaten the way of life of Christian stewardship and the identity of Christians as disciples of the Lord. During this season of Lent, let us master the great and simple truth that all the materials and productions of this world, being God's property, are intended for God's service.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> How often do we grumble when we feel that God is not near nor listening to our prayers? How often we fail to believe in His loving Presence and doubt His abiding Love. The truth is, God does not wander away from us, but rather we sometimes turn our backs on Him. The surprising and wonderous mystery is, however, if we but turn around, there he will be standing.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> What can I do or say that will show others the living water that I have found in Jesus, the water that satisfies my spiritual thirst? Will I make that my mission this week?

"Father Pat York is the Dean of Students and Vice-Rector at Conception Seminary College. Father Pat recalls he considered the priesthood during his eighth grade year. He credits his parents as having the biggest influence on his priestly vocation. They encouraged their children to be open to God's call as a priest or religious in the Church. The seed of his vocation took root in his family and grew from there. He would ask his parishioners, "Pray for the priests of our diocese. Support your parish priests. Pray fervently to the Lord for more religious vocations." Fr.
