



Dear Friends,

Today, having reached the halfway point of Lent, we celebrate Laetare Sunday. This Latin word, pronounced lay-TAR-ray, means "rejoice." We rejoice in the knowledge that the cross does not end in death, that Jesus' story does not end in the tomb. The Church also celebrates the second scrutiny today, a significant step for catechumens but also an opportunity for all of us to look into our hearts for the sinful habits and tendencies we may not even see. In today's Gospel, Jesus heals a blind man. More significantly, he can heal our blindness to sin as well. Let us rejoice!

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Today's readings explore the theme of blindness, both literal and metaphorical. The man born literally blind receives his eyesight by Jesus' action in the Gospel, but we also witness Samuel's metaphorical blindness to David's fitness for kingship, the Pharisees' blindness to Jesus' holiness, and even the willful blindness of the blind man's parents when they are questioned. May God's word help us examine our own blindnesses as we welcome the light of Christ.

STEWARDSHIP: Sin causes us to turn in on ourselves; to become grasping and exploitative toward possessions and other people; to grow accustomed to conducting relationships not by the standards of generous stewardship but by the calculus of self-interest: "What's in it for me?" Constantly, we must beg God for the grace of conversion: the grace to know who we are, to whom we belong, how we are to live the grace to repent, change and grow, the grace to become good disciples and stewards.

A REMINDER: It is said that the eye is the window of the soul. What a fantastic gift of sense – to see. To see all the wonders of God's Creation, to behold those we love, to look upon the Face of God someday. But though we may have sight, we may at times be spiritually blind, not recognizing the needs of those around us or appreciating the gifts God provides for us each day.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What keeps me from seeing the truth? What keeps me from acknowledging what I see?
