



Dear Friends,

Today, on Divine Mercy Sunday, we celebrate God's everlasting mercy, which heartened the Chosen People again and again over many centuries, found its purest expression in the sacrifice of God's only Son, and will continue to overflow into our world and all God's creation until the end of time. Conscious of both God's mercy and Jesus' command to do for the least of our brothers and sisters what he has done for us, we pray that we may be merciful and forgiving to others, sharing that most precious gift God gives us.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Today we hear the familiar story of doubting Thomas, who refused to believe until he saw the risen Lord with his own eyes and touched his wounds with his own hands. However, as soon as he *did* see Jesus and hear his voice, he immediately realized that his friends' incredible testimony was true. May Jesus' words to Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed," touch us as we struggle with doubt and uncertainty ourselves.

STEWARDSHIP: The reading from Acts describes the new community effected by Jesus' reconciling humankind with God: the People of God, the Body of Christ, the Church. The unity of this people is itself a precious good, to be cherished, preserved, and built up through lives of love. Today we are called to Stewardship: personal participation in and support of the Church's mission of proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> What is mercy and forgiveness? It is the *unconditional* act of letting go of the pain and sorrow inflicted due to a conscious or unconscious act of harm to another. God's mercy and forgiveness towards us is always *unconditional* (no strings attached) – we must learn that lesson of total surrendering of feelings of retribution and anger and allow the love we receive from God, be the love that we in turn show others.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> With eyes of faith, how do I see Christ's wounds in my community? God bless.


