

#### Dear Friends,

As we continue our Easter celebration, we give praise and thanks to God for sending the Son, who sacrificed his life to save us, who has shown us the way to eternal life. "I am the way and the truth and the life," Jesus tells his disciples in today's Gospel. They will not understand what he means until after he dies and is raised. As we already know what came later, may the words he said then inspire us to follow him now.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** During the Easter season, we are invited to reflect on all the wonderful implications of the Resurrection. The early church grew and expanded to the extent that more leaders were needed to minister to everyone. We are, as Peter puts it, "living stones," built upon the cornerstone who is Jesus. In the Gospel, Jesus assures his disciples that he is preparing dwelling places for them in his Father's house. Let us place our trust in the Lord, that we will one day reach God's dwelling place.

**STEWARDSHIP:** In the Acts, Luke tells us that the Apostles took steps to build up the Church through personal participation in and support of the Church's mission of proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying. This participation takes different forms according to people's different gifts and offices, but there is a fundamental obligation arising from the sacrament of Baptism: that Jesus' disciples are "a royal priesthood" called to offer up the world and all that is in it - especially themselves - to the Lord of all. We exercise our stewardship, not merely by our own power but by the power of the Spirit of truth, whom Jesus promises to his followers.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: The weekend of May 21, we will be taking up a Special Second Collection for the benefit of Hispanic Ministry within our North Central Vicariate. Sr. Ellen Orf has retired and Maria Gimenez has been hired as the new Coordinator of Hispanic Ministry within the Vicariate. As the Hispanic presence grows within our area and within the Catholic Church, we need to be welcoming and inviting to our Hispanic brothers and sisters and provide necessary services for their needs.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK</u>: Whom in my parish or in the wider community do I feel called to serve? How can I serve them and bring them on our journey to the Lord?

# Vocations Corner

Today our reading from the Act of the Apostles declares the institution of the Diaconate ministry. This event calls forth seven men to assist the Apostles in spreading the Kingdom of God. We are blessed in this Diocese to have so many men who have accepted the call to the Diaconate. On June 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Diaconate Class of 2023 will be ordained. "Whenever a person is ordained, he is to serve the diocesan Church. Deacons are no different in this regard: they are assigned by the bishop to ministries for which

the bishop perceives a great need, and for which the deacon may have special gifts or talents. Most often, this will be within a parish setting, just as most priests serve in a parish. Once assigned to the parish, the deacon and any other clergy assigned to the parish minister under the immediate supervision of the pastor. (USCCB)"
