Dear Friends,

Today, as we honor all those whose labor enhances our lives and the lives of others, we recognize the holiness of the work we do. Whether we labor for an employer, for our own families, or both, we set aside our own desires to expend our time and effort to do something for others. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that they must deny themselves and take up their crosses. We all have crosses that we are called to bear and some of them can be found in the work we must do for others. Let us strive to make the work we do more closely unite us with Christ.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** Jeremiah lashes out at God in today's first reading for the misery he must endure as a prophet. Saint Paul, who knew well what it was like to be persecuted, urges the Romans to sacrifice their will to God's. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that they must deny themselves and take up their crosses. Suffering is a part of life and is a necessary part of our calling as the Lord's disciples. May God's word strengthen us so that we may better endure suffering on our journey.

**STEWARDSHIP:** Stewardship invites us to reexamine suffering. Pope John Paul" points out that suffering is transformed by discovering its salvific meaning when united with the suffering of Christ. Jesus invites us to accept voluntarily penance, so that we might become liberated from those obstacles to Christian discipleship which a secularized culture exalting individual gratification places in our way.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: The Book of Genesis refers to the labor of humans as a "curse" for the Fall of Adam and Eve. But it is difficult to think of the work, labor, production, creativity of what we do as a "curse". When you do work that you love, you love the work that you do. Countless are the ways in which we are of service to others and others to us. There is a mutuality that makes our employment and our consumerism work hand and glove. Bless the work of our hands, Lord, bless the work of our hands.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> In what ways do I find it difficult to deny my own desires, priorities, and will, to follow Christ? How can my faith in the resurrection ease my willingness to do so?


